KNAM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the previous calendar quarter were:

Energy: Colorado is home to oil and gas, and coal. With that comes environmental concerns, along with health concerns.

Economy: 1st Quarter Economic Outlook – Colorado Parks and Wildlife funding uncertainties, and food stamp use

Politics: Governor Hickenlooper beginning his final year in office. Says transportation is a huge issue, both funding and futuristic transportation companies.

Child Welfare: Mesa County's rate of child abuse is one of the highest in the state. Programs to help kids, such as CASA are growing and needing volunteers.

Gun and School Safety: Local law enforcement leaders taking to social media to encourage kids to report threats. Five arrests in schools in Mesa and Montrose counties in the weeks since the Florida school shooting.
