- 1. <u>The GOP Presidential Candidate Race</u> The 2024 election year is gaining momentum as the country voted on who will represent Republicans in the Presidential race to take on incumbent Joe Biden.
- 2. <u>Local Wisconsin Politics</u> Another year of voting for Wisconsinites including referendums, mayoral races, budget allocations, legislative map redraws, and more. This quarter also included a fair share of controversy with election fraud and redistricting on the desk of state legislators.
- 3. <u>Mild Winter Weather</u> Winter has come and gone but the prototypical winter weather has been absent. That has directly impacted Wisconsin's northern counties who rely on winter sports and activities to boost their economies. The lack of winter weather has severely hampered those counties economically.
