To serve the public interest, the station broadcasts programming responsive to issues of concern to the CSRA and its listening public. The following lists issues most significant to our programming and the treatment of them:

Issues of importance this quarter included the following during the months of October, November, and December: In the month of October 2015, we welcomed several guests.
