Through a series of local news, promotional announcements and informational programs WJUB-AM 1420 has addressed the following issues of local concern for the second quarter of 2016.

The <u>Local News</u> is broadcast at 5:00 AM / 6:00 AM / 7:00 AM / 8:00 AM / 12 Noon / 3:00 PM weekdays. Each newscast is 1 -2 minutes in length. Issues covered during this quarter include;

The Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation and Sheboygan Squared are hiring retail recruiters to bring business to the Town of Sheboygan and the City of Sheboygan, respectively. But the methods the two entities are using varies greatly. The town signed a contract with a national firm for a detailed approach to attracting national retailers, while the city is relying on two locals with retail experience to reach out to boutique retailers.

A 25-year-old Sheboygan man was arrested over the weekend following a struggle with another man involving a knife. According to the Sheboygan Police Department, the two men arranged to meet on the 1000 block of Erie Avenue in Sheboygan. During the confrontation, one man sustained non-life threatening wounds from a knife and was treated at a local hospital. The 25-year-old Sheboygan man was arrested for 1st degree reckless injury, according to the release.

Above & Beyond Children's Museum and the Sailing Education Association of Sheboygan (SEAS) culminated in the christening of the "Imagination," a small dinghy recently installed in the Port of Sheboygan exhibit Thursday.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources released a draft environmental impact statement Wednesday of a golf course planned for the Lake Michigan shore by the Kohler Co., but an opponent group says the report is premature because the company has not yet made a formal proposal. The 18-hole course — Kohler's latest showpiece — would be constructed on 247 acres of company land, just north of Kohler-Andrae State Park in Sheboygan County.

Flight for Life responded to a crash involving a semi Tuesday afternoon on State 23 that saw a woman and her granddaughter seriously injured. Deputies responded to a crash on State 23 near Ridge Road in Greenbush a little after 1 p.m. on Tuesday.
