## Quarterly Community Issues Report WJUB 1420 AM 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2016 / July, August & September

Through a series of local news, promotional announcements and informational programs WJUB-AM 1420 has addressed the following issues of local concern for the third quarter of 2016.

The <u>Local News</u> is broadcast at 5:00 AM / 6:00 AM / 7:00 AM / 8:00 AM / 12 Noon / 3:00 PM weekdays. Each newscast is 1 -2 minutes in length. Issues covered during this quarter include;

A Manitowoc man was arrested and charged for lighting off Roman Candles among the crowd of people on Deland Park Beach during 4<sup>th</sup> of July festivities in Sheboygan. The suspect was also charged with four counts of bail jumping from outstanding warrants in Manitowoc and Brown counties.

Weyauwega Cheese Company, a Sun Prairie based cheese maker, has struck a deal to purchase the former Dean Foods dairy pant on Erie Avenue in Sheboygan. The company anticipates taking ownership in late July with production to begin this fall. Weyauwega Cheese says they will look to add 50 jobs in the process.

The Town of Wilson township board has voted to terminate its contract with the Black River Fire Department and instead establish its own municipal fire department by January 1, 2017. Wilson Township already owns the firehouse, engines and other fire equipment but is still in the planning stages for staffing and operation.

Plymouth will again be filled with the sound of music as eleven bands take the stage in multiple downtown venues during the 13<sup>th</sup> annual Cheese Capital Jazz & Blues Crawl for the arts this Friday. Also included is a silent auction of several works of art with proceeds to benefit the Plymouth Arts Center.

Back to school means the familiar yellow buses motoring across Sheboygan County roadways. A new look on school buses this fall is an 8 light warning system which now includes 4 amber lights that flash when the bus is preparing to stop. The amber lights switch to red when the school bus comes to a stop.

The program Focus on the Family is broadcast at 5:30 PM weekdays. Typical program topics include parenting advice, strengthening marriage relationships and incorporating faith in daily life. A list of specific daily topics is included in this report with those of local interest highlighted.

WJUB – AM provided promotional support to Love, Inc a Sheboygan County not for profit organization that mobilizes churches to provide food, clothing and shelter to those in need.

WJUB-AM provided bonus promotional support to local community events including Holland Fest in Cedar Grove, the Sheboygan Lakeshore Festival to benefit Wisconsin Children's Hospital and Praise in the Park (Plymouth City Park) to benefit the Plymouth Food Pantry .

WJUB – AM provided promotional support to the Plymouth Arts Center and their summer events including "Kids from Wisconsin", "Mill Street Live" and "13<sup>th</sup> Annual Jazz Crawl" events. P.A.C. is an area not for profit arts center and live music promote featuring local talent.
