The wedding industry -- which typically employs 885-thousand Americans -- is short-handed.

Synopsis: The County is instituting new rules that would allow local residence into the reserve for free. Tourists will have to get a reservation before they will be allowed in. Up until the restrictions due to the pandemic, many local residents were dissuaded about visiting because it was clogged by tourists

What impact it will have on businesses.

Up until this point owners say they have lost a considerable amount of money.

Synopsis: The Chamber of Commerce Hawaii reports the need to find employees in many industries during the pandemic has been a challenge. As small and private businesses start to enforce COVID-19 mandates, there's concern there won't be enough workers that can lead to negative economic impact.

Synopsis: More and more homeless are showing up in Waimanalo. A local resident is taking it on her own to create a community for those who are houseless. Using her own resources she has turned 7 acres of land into a homestead. The residents appreciate her effort and are learning to more independent.

Slug: Restaurant test people for COVID

Date: 9/14/2021 **Newscast**: 5/6/10 pm

Synopsis: To avoid losing customers because of Oahu's COVID-19 vaccine mandate, a local restaurant owner went through certification to administer Coronavirus tests outside his establishment for customers. He says it's been effective economically to retain customers who are not vaccinated, and didn't take a test.

Slug: Tourism Jobs Date: 9/22/2021

Newscast: AM/Noon/5 pm

Length: 1:24

Synopsis: State Senator Kirk Favella is calling on the Governor to reinstate covid testing on travelers. He says the increase in cases can be traced to those who have travelled off island and are bringing back the virus. He notes that when the state was testing travelers the spread was less.

He says he has a lot more jobs from homeowners and he thinks it's because of the coronavirus. Maybe people are staying at home and thinking about doing things to their home.

Synopsis: The courts have ruled that NCAA athletes can make money off their image. Is this a good idea

for the student and the school? What are the pitfall from this new decision?

Slug: Free Lunch Date: 7/15/2021 Newscast: 5/6/10 pm

Synopsis: Fears about the spread of the Coronovirus, the Department of Education today announced that all public school children will receive free meals at school. Previously, on children who financially qualified could get free meals, but this year every child is eligible. DOE explains, this process will avoid

the need for students and cafeteria personnel from having to exchange money. DOE will be using federal money to pay for the expansion. Cafeteria workers and parents approve of this new plan.

But local residents want them to go somewhere else. They say the tourists have no respect for the land and the community and trash the beach and the neighborhood.

Synopsis: Weather experts warn that this summer looks to be a dry one. That means residents need to be ready for possible wildfires by clearing their lands, creating defensible space. Local fire departments are also gearing up for a long hot summer.

Slug: Don't Touch the Wildlife

Synopsis: Recent social media posts show tourists engaging with Hawaii's protected wildlife in ways that are illegal. Synopsis: The state will start buying electric cars for all departments. The goal is to reduce carbon

Plus the residents who live in the area support the closure as visitors jam up parking in the area. Opponents of the initiative argue that the Stair have been mismanaged.

He says his team is ready to get out and educate people about fire safety.

Synopsis: The deer overpopulation on Maui is becoming a big problem, according to lawmakers, police, as well as residents. Vehicle collisions with deer are up over 55 percent this year over last year. The county has now formed a task force to take a deeper look at the problem and find a solution.

They advise property owners to inspect their grounds and trees to see if there is any signs of distress and be prepared to take down the tree if needed.

HEALTH & SAFTEY

Synopsis: City and County of Honolulu hopes to improve pedestrian safety. The latest change is the shared streets program, where a pilot project installs roundabouts to hopefully slow down drivers and prevent accidents in an area where neighbors have been demanding a safety solution.

Synopsis: Governor David Ige signed it into law that increases penalties for crimes against senior citizens.

Synopsis: After months of planning, people who received their Covid-19 vaccines outside Hawaii are able to by-pass the state's mandatory quarantine. Verification is done to try and avoid potential spread of the coronavirus.

Synopsis: A new law forces lifeguards to extend operations. The department reports the need is great because more people are headed back in the water as COVID-19 restrictions relax, so are the number of rescues that occur outside of normal operating hours.
