

PROGRAM TYPE & EXPLANATION OF REGULARLY SCHEDULED PROGRAMS

Good Day Philadelphia/ News -- Weekdays, 5am - 9am. This live program, produced by WTXF-TV, covers areas of national, regional, and local interests and routinely features in-depth treatment of local issues, including live guests and remote broadcasts throughout the program.

First News at 11 on FOX 29 / News -- Weekdays, 11 – 11:30am. In addition to coverage of fast-breaking news stories, this program routinely features in-depth, 1- to 2-minute treatment of local issues, produced by WTXF-TV.

FOX 29 News at Five / News -- Weekdays, 5-6pm. In addition to coverage of fast-breaking news stories, this program routinely features in-depth, 1- to 2-minute treatment of local issues, produced by WTXF-TV.

FOX 29 News at Six / News -- Saturdays and Sunday, 5-6pm. In addition to coverage of fast-breaking news stories, this program routinely features in-depth, 1- to 2-minute treatment of local issues, produced by WTXF-TV.

FOX 29 News at Ten / News -- Daily, 10pm to 11pm. In addition to coverage of fast-breaking news stories, this program routinely features in-depth, 1- to 2-minute treatment of local issues, produced by WTXF-TV.

FOX News Sunday/ News -- Sundays, 9am - 10am. Produced by the FOX Network, this weekly news program, hosted by Chris Wallace, is broadcast live and covers issues of national interest. Summary of Major Issues Treated During the Quarter:

Business/Economy/Consumer – FOX 29 Consumer Reporter Michelle Williams teams up with “Consumer Reports” to offer viewers regular in-depth segments on products and services which include how-to’s, reviews, and where to get the best deals for your money.

Crime – In an effort to help Philadelphia combat its ongoing murder problem, FOX 29 reporter Dave Schratwieser regularly reports on “FOX Unsolved,” a series which tells the story of a person who has been murdered and their case is unsolved. The series is designed to garner leads and tips for police from viewers who might have information to help solve the crime. In addition, Dave Schratwieser began a series of new reports called “Serve and Protect,” which focus on stories about local police who have gone beyond the call of duty to “Serve and Protect” citizens.

Environment – “FOX e” is a regular series of stories focusing on environmental issues from saving energy, to recycling, to living a “green” life. FOX 29 news anchor Kerri-Lee Halkett regularly reports on “Trash Talk,” a series of reports in which FOX 29 profiles an area or neighborhood suffering from trash and blight. We put a team of volunteers together, along with residents of the area, and clean it up. The story follows the progress of the area from pre-clean-up to post clean-up, and profiles volunteers making a difference.

Government – In this busy election season, FOX 29 reports regularly on both local, state and national candidates and the issues that effect the election. Stories educate viewers on candidates’ positions on the issues and offer commentary on how that will affect local viewers.

Health & Medical – FOX 29 Medical Reporters Dr. Mike Cirigliano and Dr. Brian McDonough report the latest medical news in “Health Talk.” This quarter FOX 29 kicks off its “Organize For Life” campaign, which focuses on the issue of organ and tissue donation. “Gift of Life” organ donor program is our partner in the campaign, which features regular reports on the programs and services of “Gift of Life” and stories to motivate viewers to become organ donors. The campaign continues through April and culminates with the Annual Dash For Organ Donor Awareness event, which raises funds and awareness of the issue.

Youth – Every week, FOX 29 reports on the Police Athletic League in Philadelphia, which is a non-profit organization in which Philadelphia police come together to serve as role models for young people and attempt to keep them off the streets and out of trouble. Most often the story focuses on an outstanding PAL kid and how PAL has changed their life, but occasionally the stories focus on PAL officers, volunteers, or programs at the PAL center.
