

FENTANYL DEATHS

The scourge of the opioid epidemic impacts Americans from every demographic group, in every state. According to the CDC, more than 42,000 people died from opioid overdoses in 2016, and according to provisional CDC data, that number jumped to more than 49,000 opioid overdose deaths in 2017. Nowhere is the problem more pronounced, however, than in our state of New Jersey, which has one of the highest opioid overdose death rates among all states for individuals age 35 and younger. In 2016, 1,584 drug deaths in New Jersey involved opioids, including 204 deaths in Ocean County, 137 in Monmouth County and 45 in Mercer County.

Committee along party lines, would expand the tax on aviation fuel to cover all fuel purchased in New Jersey. Currently, the state's 4-cent tax is only levied on the fuel that's used by airplanes during taxiing and takeoffs.
