

The average family with two kids will pay 25% of their income on child care, while a low income family can spend up to 70% of their income just for their children to be watched at daycare. Executive Director of the Advocates for Children in New Jersey, Celia Zalkind, says the cost of living in the Garden State forces these daycare centers to charge more.
