

Just three years ago, she was bouncing in and out of hospital emergency rooms as she suffered from suicidal thoughts. Today, however, that's changed and it's largely because of her newfound bond with alpacas. High Point Farm is owned by Fountain House, the NYC-based organization dedicated to helping the mentally ill find new skills. Each year, hundreds of the nonprofit's members spend weeks at a High Point Farm, tending to its many animals. By the end of their stays, members say they've grown in ways they could never imagine.
