

The robotic arm assistance is known as MAKOplasty, which costs about \$1 million. With this technology, the surgeon uses an interactive 3D monitor visualization system. Using a CT scan of the patient's knee, the system provides the surgeon with a pre-operational plan for customized implant positioning. During the surgery, the computer system will generate a 3D image of the hip or knee showing the pre-programmed surgical plan. Then the image on the monitor appears with various colored areas tracking what portions of the bone need to be removed and then implanted.
