

I NEARLY LOST CUSTODY OF MY KIDS BECAUSE I'M GAY

On October of 2012, Chavie Weisberger's ex-husband, Naftali Weisberger, sued the formerly Hasidic mom for sole custody of their three young children. The following month, a judge ordered that the kids be immediately removed from her care. After divorcing her husband in 2009, Chavie had eventually come out as a lesbian, shocking her friends, family and ex-husband, who had since remarried and started a new family. In 2015, Brooklyn Judge Eric Prus awarded Naftali sole legal and residential custody of their two daughters and one son and even forbade her from discussing her sexuality with her youngest children. Shortly after the 2015 court decision, Chavie was hired as a community engagement coordinator at Footsteps, the organization that helps the ultra-Orthodox adapt to the broader world. She fought the decision, and this summer, an appeals court reversed the ruling, granting the doting mom full custody of her kids, now ages 10, 12 and 14 provided she keeps a kosher home and continues to keep the children in Hasidic schools. FLU UPDATE - TAMIFLU SHORTAGE

Pharmacists in New Jersey and across the country are dealing with the shortage of pre-bottled liquid Tamiflu by creating their own compound for the formula using Tamiflu capsules and sweet syrup. The outbreak of the H1N1 virus and an early seasonal flu has caused a spike in demand for the antiviral prescription medicine, said John Norton, a spokesman for National Community Pharmacists Association. While compounding is not an unusual practice among pharmacists, it is often done when no commercial alternative exists. Pre-bottled liquid Tamiflu has always been readily available.
