

None of those facts are disputed and they were all admitted as part of a plea bargain and subsequent appeal which resulted in Vanaman's 2009 sentencing of 6 years in prison for passion provocation manslaughter and tampering with evidence. Last week, after just five-years, he walked out of a halfway house a free man. However, the family of Vanaman's murdered wife says that he was treated differently because he was a former police officer and they feel that Barb's life is basically being ignored.
