Week 1 (Week of (January 1-7, 2023)

Week 2 (Week of (January 8-14,2023)

(Mustang News on KCPR covered the Rose Bowl parade from the week before, where Cal Poly's float won a prize. Coverage of the storms happening locally made broadcasts on the 9th and 10th prerecorded and remote. The team also covered the impacts of the storm as well as continuous coverage on the missing boy Kyle Doan. National news included Elon Musk's lawyers wanting to move a trial out of SF and President Joe Biden's visit to the border.)

Week 3 (Week of (January 15-21,2023)

(This week, the shooting in Visalia California was covered multiple times with many updates. Kyle Doan updates also continued. The GOP push to unseal documents found at President Biden's home was mentioned as well as news on the Holocaust survivor visiting Cal Poly's campus. Updates from the floods from the week prior were also provided.)

Week 4 (Week of (January 22-28)

(Mustang News on KCPR)

(Breaking and continuous coverage of the Half Moon Bay shooting occurred throughout this week, with reporters breaking updates as they became known. California universities carrying abortion-inducing pills was also covered. Updates on inflation, as well as the on-campus organization, Safer's, National Stalking Awareness month events were covered. Traffic closures because of weather also was present in the broadcasts this week.

Week 5 (Week of (January 29-February 4,2023)

(Coverage early in the week included what to expect locally when the Covid-19 state of emergency is lifted, updates on the probe into Biden's sealed documents, and updates on America's debt crisis. Additionally, reporters covered vigils happening in San Luis Obispo and nationwide for Tyre Nichols, a

black man who died after being beaten by police officers who pulled him over for a traffic stop. An in-depth look into the struggling graphic design department was also shared with listeners.

Week 6 (Week of (February 5-11,2023)

(Topics and issues covered this week include the extreme weather in Austin, Texas, the body found by kayakers in the Santa Ynez river, and the closure of the disaster recovery center in SLO. The Chinese spy balloon and its subsequent destruction was covered multiple times this week as well as North Korea's display of its nuclear missiles.

(This week, a bicyclist was killed in a hit-and-run in San Luis Obispo. His death was covered in the KCPR newscasts multiple times.
