Newsmakers 10-02-2022

Organizers of Ratoberfest, an event at Beacon Dragway in Paducah, join the Greg Dunker Show to discuss their event which benefits The Merryman House. Kayla Myers of The Merryman House Domestic Crisis Center talks about the services they provide to women, men, and children in western Kentucky. Myers also talks about another of their fundraisers the Paducky Derby(0:00-8:48). Coy Elliott joined the Greg Dunker Show to talk about Amaizing Farms in Mayfield, a business destroyed by the 2021 tornado. Elliott spoke about working for nearly a year to build back(8:48-15:00).

Newsmakers 10-09-2022

Ryan Quarles joined The Greg Dunker Show to talk about his bid for the GOP nomination for Kentucky Governor. (0:00-5:36) Tracy Lawrence of Sunrise Childrens Services appeared with Greg Dunker to bring awareness to the number of children in Kentucky in foster care, needing permanent homes. Then Eric Grogan from West Kentucky Fellowship of Christian Athletes joined to promote their Gamechanger Banquet to celebrate what God is doing in local sports and raise funds to continue the mission(11:14-15:00).

Dr. Jeff spoke with Tyler Bell from Paducah International Raceway and Tracy Lawrence from Sunrise Children's Services promoting an event at the track where funds will be raised for Sunrise, an organization that provides safe housing for foster children. PIR and Sunrise are bring awareness that there are 9,000 children in Kentucky in foster care. Finally, Watts was joined by Henderson County Extension Agent Ella Furquin to discuss partnering with Murray State to help high school students show livestock and the importance of agriculture in Kentucky.

The Hugs Project sends boxes of toiletries, snacks, and personal items to soldiers deployed overseas who wouldn't get mail from home otherwise. They send a box a month to the soldiers for the length of the deployment. Ferguson talked about sending over 57,000 boxes to troops in support of our armed forces. Then Alan Watts of Travelin' the Bluegrass spoke to UK Extension agent David Furquin talking about the swine show at the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville. Students from all over the country came to show livestock. Then, Watts spoke with Jace Dunn about the dairy show at the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville.
