ISSUE: American military readiness

PROGRAM: Family Talk

DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 11/10/22, 7:30 am and 11:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Jerry Boykin, Executive Vice president of the Family Research Council discussed concerns about American military readiness. Boykin said the military is in a steep decline. Boykin claims the emphasis the military has taken on indoctrination to secular politics and social norms means the military is spending less time training to defend our country. Boykin warns that because of this shift in focus, fewer young people are joining the military, making America more vulnerable and less prepared for combat readiness. He said a return to a military focus and moving away from the current course can help American return to greatness.

ISSUE: Testing hay for cow-calf operations

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 20 min.

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator and Mary Drewnoski, Extension Beef Systems Specialist, discussed the need test hay for herd health and efficient herd management. Drewnoski said knowing the quaiuty of hay helps operators make the right decision in supplementation level so that operators are not spending more money than is necessary. They urged producers to take a representative forage sample to make sure the total digestible nutrients with crude protein are in proper range for growing heifers to make them ready to breed. Information to help measure are available through extension offices and websites.

ISSUE: Congressional balance of power, property rights issues

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Michael Swaine form the Quincy Institute for Statecraft, discussed the recent US-China summit that focused on how both countries can lay the groundwork for stronger economic ties, despite tensions surrounding Taiwan. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the implications of Republicans winning control of the US House of Representatives. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the controversy surrounding property owners being forced out of their homes to make way for a chip plant funded by President Biden's "Made in America" program.

DESCRIPTION: Host Don Wight, Hoby Bruhn and Brandy Essen, Coordinator for the Visitation and Advocacy Center in Gillette, Wyoming discussed the need for more involvement by willing and qualified people to help protect and assist foster care children and make in home contact and oversight as a court appointed special advocate. Essen discussed the requirements and opportunities to serve in this program that helps kids stay safe and ensure they are in healthy home providing proper care for them. Hoby Bruhn discussed his experiences in serving as an advocate, urging involvement.

ISSUE: Regulating big tech, Home Asset Forfeiture problems

PROGRAM- American Radio Journal

DURATION- 30 min.

AIREG: 10/2/22, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henrey and Jessica Melugin of the Competitive Enterprise Institute discuss state efforts to regulate big tech, as several states have passed laws forcing media giants to make their formats safer for children and to protect privacy rights. More states are considering laws to regulate big tech since Congress has been ineffective in passing similar laws. Dan Greenburg talked about legal challenges being brought against Home Asset Forfeiture laws, challenging the constitutionality of such laws and that often such laws are an abuse of power. Colin Hanna from Let Freedom Ring, USA discussed the importance of Ukraine winning the war against Russian aggression.

ISSUE: Sanctions on Russia, Congressional action during "Lame Duck Session", Supreme Court Case regarding free speech

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henrey talked with Christine McDaniel from the Mercatus Center at George Mason University about new economic sanctions on Russia in response to their continued aggression against Ukraine. Scott Parkinson of Club For Growth discussed what Democrats may do in a "Lame Duck Session" of Congress. Parkinson says the danger is that laws could be introduced and passed that may not reflect the will of the people of the incoming Congress. Chris Riley of R Street Institute discussed the two Supreme Court cases involving free speech and social media and its implications for all Americans.

DESCRIPTION: Host Don Wight and Jeannie Miller, Director of 2nd Chance Ministries, a prisoner reentry program discussed the challenges faced by those who have been released from prison but do not have assets or resources to quickly integrate back into the community. Miller discussed the programs available through the ministry, providing housing facilities for both men and women and also talked about the counseling, prayer and practical support the ministry and those in the community provide to give formerly incarcerated people a 2nd change to succeed and turn their lives around. Miller also discussed the opportunities available for people to help the program through volunteering.

ISSUE: Parental advice for talking about topics that can confuse children

PROGRAM: Family Talk

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. Tim Clinton and Dan Seaborn, founder of Winning At Home, an organization that supports marriages and families and author of 13 books, discussed how parents should approach talking with their children about changing social norms and confusing issues that children are being confronted with. Seaborn says parents should be understanding and have a solid spiritual, moral and ethical foundation in discussing these issues. Seaborn says parents should be patient and allow children to express their issues and ask questions about subjects that may be uncomfortable for parents to discuss.

ISSUE: Excessive federal regulations, governor and senate races' impact

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and John Gizzi of Newsmax discussed the multiple governor and senate races and their impact on the states and the balance of power in the Senate, particularly in Pennsylvania and Arizona. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the details of this year's Ten Thousand Commandments, the Competitive Enterprise Institute's annual review of the size, scope and cost of federal regulations and how they impact American consumers, businesses and the U.S. economy at large. Boehm says the continued pressure of excessive and growing regulatory control has dramatically hindered the growth and prosperity of America.

ISSUE: Technology in Cow-Calf production systems

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger and Yijie Xong, Production Livestock Management Specialist discussed new technology in cow-calf operations and considerations that need to be made on what to use. They talked about guidelines to think through such as production goals, expected return on investment, understanding risk vs. reward, ability to upgrade technologies as innovations grow and making sure technology has been properly tested in grazing beef cows in similar management/environment as your ranch. Xong said technology properly used can assist with labor issues, animal health and well being and increase overall efficiency of the cow-calf operation.

ISSUE: National educational achievement, "millionaires tax", nuclear threats

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Aaron Withe of the Freedom Foundation discussed the disappointing Nation's Report Card on educational achievement., showing the scores have declined in many key categories of learning. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth talked about the general election and it's impact on future legislation. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked about the new "millionaires tax" in Massachusetts, which is a tax of 4% on income above 1 million, in addition to the state's 5 % flat tax. Boehm said this tax could be a model some Democratic states may try to adopt.

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, T.L. Meyer, both Nebraska Extension Educators and Travis Mullinks, UNL Beef Cattle Nutritionist discussed the importance of knowing the herd's nutritional requirements and being prepared to make rapid changes in nutritional management if needed. They also stressed the need to know the quality and quantity of forage resources. They also discussed things to consider winter management of herds, such as using the body condition score as a guide, obtaining a nutritional analysis of forage resources and adjusting supplemental energy for periods of cold stress, especially for thin cows.

Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked with Jonathan Bydlak of the R Street Institute about the growing national debt and the future economic burden being place on American taxpayers.

They recommend getting a hay test to verify plant maturity, fertilization and moisture before the hay was cured, determine what pests and weeds are common in the area you're purchasing hay from and getting a forage nitrate test prior to purchase. Berger and Beckman also urged producers to make sure you have plenty of hay on hand if you have to start feeding early.
