ISSUE: Solving social problems, federal budget deadlines, national debt

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min

AIRED: 1/7/24, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and E.J. Antoni of the Heritage Foundation discussed social problems in American and that ESG economics will not solve them as they are not economically rooted. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth talked about looming federal budget deadlines and priorities. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the growing pressure being put on the U.S. economy by the growing national debt.

ISSUE: Federal appliance regulations, new federal regulations on the gig economy.

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Ben Lieberman of the Competitive Enterprise Institute talked about how federal regulators are targeting household appliances with cumbersome rules and requirements which will drive up the cost for consumers. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the new federal regulations on the gig economy and impose new rules related to the use by employers of short term contractors and freelance workers as opposed to permanent jobs. Boehm sees the regulations as another overreach by the Biden Administration.

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Dr. Tim Elmore, founder and CEO of Growing Leaders, a non-profit organization created to encourage and equip young adults to take on real-life opportunities in their careers and communities. Dr. Elmore and his wife, Pam discussed the need for parents to teach their children how to be leaders and to stand for their convictions, rather than just follow the crowd. The Elmore's urged parents and other adults to convey to children that they have the potential to be great leaders, regardless of their personalities. Dr. Elmore has authored over 35 books.

ISSUE: Moving a cowherd toward optimum productivity

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator discussed the need to find a balance between biggest and best in the use by producers of genetic selection tools. Berger pointed out that Dr. Bob Taylor of Colorado State University said that "profitable cattle are usually productive, but productive cattle are not always profitable. Berger says cow calf producers have have EPDs (expected progeny differences) and index tools to make genetic selection decisions related to traits that impact levels of productivity and longevity. He says producers can work with beef cattle genetic specialists and breed association representatives to help them identify what EPD levels for milk, weaning weight and mature weight best meet their target.

ISSUE: Inflation pressures, regulation for the digital media, Ukraine war

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min.

AIRED: 1/28/24, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and David Ditch of the Heritage Foundation explained how massive federal spending is fueling inflation and continuing to put pressure on American's daily lives and the overall U.S. economy. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the call from Congress to put more regulations on digital media in light of the influence it is having, good and bad, on our country. Dr. Paul Kengor of the Institute for Faith and Freedom at Grove City College discussed the ongoing Ukraine War and its effect on Ukraine and on the U.S. and world economy with no real solution in sight.

ISSUE: Healthy Living

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Dr. Paul Reisser, a retired family practitioner and author of "Complete Guide To Family Health, Nutrition, and Fitness" and "Complete Guide to Baby and Child Care:", discussed the fact that cardiovascular disease and various types of cancer still top the charts as the major cause of death worldwide. Dr. Reisser discussed the need for healthy living to be a priority. He talked about the difference that can be made by carving out time to eat right, exercise, get proper amounts of sleep and see your doctor regularly. He discussed the need to take charge now rather than wait for a health crisis to make positive, healthy choices.

ISSUE: U.S. index of military strength, Republican Presidential primary

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Dakota Wood of the Heritage Foundation discussed the findings of the annual "Index of U.S. Military Strength" that shows the U.S. military as "weak" and at significant risk of not being able to meet the demands of a single major regional conflict while attending to various presence and engagement activities. The report also find that China, Russia, Iran and North Korea are advancing military capabilities. Scott Parkinson of the Real Story discussed the race for the Republican presidential nomination and prospects for future primaries with only two candidates remaining in the race.

DESCRIPTION: Gray Bauer and guests John Strege, Marlene Strege, the first couple to adopt a frozen fertilized egg and carry it through to a successful pregnancy, and Hanna Strege, the first adopted frozen embryo in the world, discussed the process, the risks, and the possibility as an option for couples unable to have children naturally. They also discussed the ethics of preserving the embryos. Hanna Strege discussed her goal to one day open her own adoption counseling practise.

ISSUE: Keys to prosperous start for newborn calves

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 15 min.

AIRED: 2/11/24, 10:30 am

DESCRIPTION: Connor Biehler and Hannah (Greenwell) Smith, Nebraska Extension Educators, discussed the important steps that producers need take to insure a prosperous calving season and start for newborn calves. They discussed the calf health management steps that begin prior to calving. A key component is to ensure calves receive colostrum within the first four hours post-calving. They also talked about the need quickly identify health issues in calves, especially in the first 2 months of a calf's life, such as calf scours the most lethal ailment in the first 30 days of a calf's life. Producers should take steps to prevent an outbreak in their herd.

ISSUE: Inflation and current economic pressures, immigration

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Phil; Kerpen from American Commitment discussed the pressures inflation continues to put on the U.S. economy and the American consumer. While inflation has eased in some areas it continues to take a bite out of American's budget, particularly in food prices that have remains stubbornly high. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the collapse of the Senate immigration deal and prospects for future prospects for a solution to the open borders crisis. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked about the impact and advantages of allowing foreign airlines fly domestic routes.

She talked about her passionate work in trying to make the internet safer for children by working to get the technology industry, legal community and the public to push for more protections through legislation and parental and community awareness. She also called on corporate America to filter pornography and child sex abuse images on public Wi-Fi.

Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the negative impact of high interest rates that are putting great pressure on American's ability to purchase homes, cars and other high ticket items.

ISSUE: Getting first time mother cows bred for second time

DESCRIPTION: Karla Wilke, UNL Cow-Calf Systems Specialist and Kacie McCarthy, UNL Cow-Calf Specialist talked about the challenges for producers to get the first time mother cows bred for a second time. Producers face the loss of income from the potential calf crop and depreciation of the cow. They discussed that if bred heifer is developed or purchased for a value of \$2800 and is sold as a slaughter cow after one calf for \$1350, then the depreciation cost of the cow is \$1450. They talked about the other side of this issue that mature cows do not have the same requirements as growing, lactating first calf heifers, as growing , lactating cows have greater nutrient requirements. Producers who need help in heifer development can contact their local extension office.
