ISSUE: Supreme Court ruling on EPA powers, primary elections, inflation.

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 7/3/22, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Greg Whitstone of the CO2 Coalition discussed the impact of the Supreme Court's ruling curtailing the regulatory powers of the Environmental Protection Agency, seen by many as a welcome reigning in of out-of-control EPA powers. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the effect of primary elections in Utah, Illinois, and South Carolina. Parkinson says the impact could have national implications. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the inflationary effect of states giving out stimulus checks and its impact on the U.S. economy.

ISSUE: Spike in gasoline and home heating costs, recession looming

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 7/10/22, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Merrill Mathews from the Institute for Policy Innovation talked about how the Biden Administration's polices have been responsible for the spike in gasoline and home heating costs. Matthews discussed the moves that need to be made to ease pressure on these costs. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the looming signs of recession and the economic impact on U.S. families. Parkinson points outh that rising incomes have not been able to keep pace with rising inflation.

ISSUE: Education freedom for families

PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 7/15/22, 7:30 am and 11:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. Tim Clinton and former U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos, author of the book "Hostages No More: The Fight for Education Freedom and the Future of the American Child", discussed the battle to preserve and promote great education by giving parents and students the freedom of school choice. DeVos points out that for the past 35 years she has advocated for school for K-12 students choice and encourages parents and students to stay in the fight against those who would try to take thios choice away. She says we need to engage politicians and local leaders to also protect and promote this American right.

ISSUE: Weighing risk and reward of annual Forages for cow-calf operations

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 27 min. AIRED: 7/17/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger, Nebraska extension educator and Beef Specialist Mary Drewnoski discussed the fact that because of early dry conditions followed by late wet conditions have caused some fields to be designated prevented planting acres, subsidized by the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture. Drewnoski says producers should carefully introduce livestock to mixes a little at a time and turn them out after allowing them to fill up on hay first. Brassicas, including turnips, grape seed and kale are an option due to high levels of crude protein and digestible carbohydrates. If these are planted in late July to early August they provide great potential for late Autumn grazing.

ISSUE: Biden's possible climate change emergency declaration, recession fears

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henery and Myron Ebell of the Competitive Enterprise Institute discussed the plan by President Biden to declare a climate change emergency and the impact it would have on small business and families by giving Biden power to push forth rules that could be negatively impact our freedoms and the U.S. economy. by placing burdens on farmers and other industries regulated by the EPA. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked about the possibility of a recession and that he believes the signs point to the the fact that we are already in a recession. Boehm urged politicians to act now to reduce inflation's effect on the U.S. economy.

ISSUE: Supplementing yearlings in the summer grazing season

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min.

DESCRIPTION: Nebraska Extension Educator Aaron Berger and Kaylee Wheeler, UNI Animal Science Dept. Director discussed how to assess the value of supplementing yearlings and the best way to do it if producers decide it is a good choice for their operation. Wheeler says forage quality and yearling rate of gain decline through the summer, particularly in cool season grasses so so supplementing yearlings with dry distillers grains in the second half of the summer as the grass quality declines will increase average daily gain bu may not increase returns. Wheeler says because of market changes, producers need to do the research to make sure supplementing is cost effective for their operation,

ISSUE: The effect of worry and pressure on girls and parent's role in raising worry-free girls

PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min. AIRED: 8/6/22, 7 am

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. Tim Clinton and Sissy Goff, counselor and author of "Raising Worry-Free Girls discussed the impact anxiety on girls being raised in their formative years. Goff says anxiety always involves an overestimation of the problem and the underestimation of self. Goff urges parents not to affirm their girl's anxiety but to build confidence in her by building confidence and affirming that girls can rise above anxiety.

ISSUE: Inflation reduction, primary elections

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min AIRED: 8/7/22, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Eric Boehm of Reason magazine discussed the Inflation Reduction Act and examined its costs that defy the title of the bill. Boehm says the bill provides excessive spending in non essential ares that will have a negative impact of the economy by increasing inflation rather than reducing it. Boehm says it also includes more layers of regulation that will particularly have a negative impact on lower and middle class families and small businesses. Scott Parkinson of Club For Growth discussed the impact of primary elections in Missouri, Arizona, Michigan and Washington.

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Sandra Felton, founder and president of Messies Anonymous, a group dedicated to bringing harmony to homes through understanding and aiding the "messy mindset". Felton discussed the pressure being placed on homes and marriages by the everyday needs of jobs and families and how things can become very chaotic and disorganized. Felton said that gave advice on how to stay organized and how to deal with a messy spouse or child. Felton says helping the messiy one see the need to change is important and advised not to enable them by organizing and cleaning up messes for them. She encouraged families to discuss and make a plan to stay organized and avoid a clutter filled, messy home environment.

ISSUE: Ukraine war and the humanitarian crisis

PROGRAM: Life Issues DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 8/7/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Don Wight and Darrell Henson, President of Instep Ministries, a ministry operation missions and churches in Ukraine, Russia and Eastern Europe, Discussed the war between Russia and Ukraine and the effect the war is having on families, pastors and churches. Henson, currently operating out of Poland, says the humanitarian and economic crisis being created by the war has been devastating, but also has been opening doors of ministry in all the region. Henson says the refugees being created by the war is putting pressure on surrounding countries, many of which are in weaker economies than Ukraine. He encouraged people to support ministries and missions operating in the region.

ISSUE: Alternatives to corn silage in drought conditions

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 29 min. AIRED: 8/14/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator and Karla Wilke, Cow-Calf Specialist discussed the need for producers to include silage to reduce ration cost, improve the energy content of the diet and add moisture, which can serve as a ration conditioner. Wilke says silage can be made from small grains such as rye, wheat, oats, triticale or barley or from summer annual forages. Wilke says producers should be aware that not all silages are the same quality.

ISSUE: Inflation Reduction Act, IRS agents and their impact

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Thomas Phillipson of the University of Chicago disussed the impact and cost of the Inflation reducation Act and that the bill's provisions will certainly lead to massive growing debt and further harm families, communities and small bussinesses. Scott Parkinson of Club for Growth talked about the plan to add 87,000 new IRS agents and the potential dangers of this massive number of agents and perhaps more complicated regulations that may be created.

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Andrew Crapuchettes of RedBallon.work discussed the death of big city downtowns due to crime and violence, driving. They discussed the exodus of businesses from downtown areas. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the primary election results in Florida and Oklahoma and the impact on the mid-term elections in November. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked aboout the economic impact of President Biden's student loan forgiveness executive order. Boehm discussed the unfairness of making those who did not incur the debt pay for it.

ISSUE: Cow-Calf operation profit under drought conditions.

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min. AIRED: 8/28/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry, Nebraska Extension Educator and Elliot Dennis, Livestock Marketing and Risk Management economist discussed factors indicating that herd liquidation is the best option and should continue. Dennis says consideration for producers during drought should include examining limited forage and production, high feed costs and high cull cow prices due to

consumer demand for ground beef. These considerations should be weighed against costs to rebuild herds, such as strong export demand, strong consumer demand and higher fed and feeder cattle futures

prices.

ISSUE: Preventing teen suicide PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

DESCRIPTION: Dr. James Dobson and Dr. Tim Clinton discussed the resons teen suicide continues to take so many young lives. They explained that adolescence can be emotionally difficult for teenagers. Their lack of self-worth can sometimes lead to the tragedy of suicide. They talked about the need for parents to look for warning signs in teen behavior and messaging and how best to respond. Clinton says the key is communicate unconditional love and seek help when the warning signs are being seen by parents and friends.
