ISSUE: Teacher Union decline, rising child care and work costs

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 1/1/23, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Jason Dudash of the Oregon Freedom Foundation discussed the declining membership in teachers unions. Dudash sited sebveral reasons, but also says the increasing political pressures unions put on their membership is driving many away from the liberal leaning philosophies being promoted by unions. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the rising costs of work and child care. A combination of inflationary transportation, child care expenses and work costs not keeping up with compensation are creating an economic hardship that is increasingly affecting more low and middle class employees and families.

ISSUE: Childhood obesity PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED:1/4/23 7:30 am and 11:30 pm (part 1); 1/5/23 7:30 and 11:30 pm (part 2)

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson discussed childhood obesity with Ali Elliot, a registered dietician at Thrive Pediatric Nutrition in Birmingham Alabama. Elliot said 1 in 5 kids suffer from obesity in America and kids are eating about 1.8 daily servings of fruits and vegetables, less than half of the recommendation of 4.5 servings. Elliot said the deterioration of the family and the busy lifesyles of families are contributing factors compounding the problem. Elliot recommended balancing the diet of kids and making sure they are getting the proper nutritional combination for optimal health and weight.

ISSUE: Inflation costs impact on American families, immigration backlog

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 1/8/23

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and E.J Antoni of the Heritage Foundation discussed the continued and growing problem of inflation and its negative affect on the U.S. economy and the pressure it is putting on families, particularly low and middle class Americans. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the spending on the Infrastructure Bill and its impact on communities. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine and David Bier of the Cato Institute talked about the backlog processing legal immigrants at the same time unprecedented numbers of people are entering the U.S. illegally.

ISSUE: Windbreaks for livestock producers

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min. AIRED: 1/15/23 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger and Brad Schick, both Nebraska Extension Educators, discussed the advantages of windbreaks with a V configuration as a way to protect livestock from prevailing winds, providing downwind protection 5 times the height of the fence. They explained that wind increases heat loss in livestock during the winter and can penetrate the hair coat, allowing cold air to reach the skin, accelerating the loss of heat. Berger and Schick pointed out that the windbreaks can be permanent or temporary, porous or non porous to fit the needs of the operation and reduce cold stress during calving season.

ISSUE: The national debt ceiling, effect of the carbon tax

Bryan Riley of the National Taxpayers Union Foundation discussed the negative impact of a carbon tax that would be in effect another tax on fossil fuels and would hurt businesses, and most of all, consumers.

Trueman pointed out the growing damaging effects on brain, altering it and the addictive effect, increasing the desire for it and its consumption. Trueman said families, marriages and society is being weakened by pornography consumption, particularly the distortion of relationships and the corrupting effect it is having on children and youth.

ISSUE: Spring annual forages

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min. AIRED: 2/5/23 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator, Jerry Volesky, Extension Range and Forage Specialist and Daren Redfearn, Forage and Crop Residue Specialist discussed the need for producers to start planning and thinking about Spring annual forages that they might plant and to anticipate the need for extra feed or booking seed early. Redfearn and Volesky said Spring planted small grain cereals yield about 2.5- 4.0 tons per acre, depending on growing conditions. The group discussed options that are available for producers and to plan the budget to meet the needs of the operation. They encouraged producers to reach out to extension offices and extension specialists for advice in planning a successful and profitable operation. Offices have planning tables and information available for producers.

ISSUE: School choice, wealth tax PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Jason Bedrick of the Heritage Foundation discussed recent victories in promoting school choice, including the Supreme Court in favor of school choice. Jonathan Williams discussed the negative economic impact of the proposed wealth tax, which would also trickle down and effect jobs and the overall U.S. economy.

They cited a report stating that 25.6% of operations reported weather as the main cause for death in calves less than 3 weeks old. The first step for producers to understand when to intervene by rewarming the calves when their temperature drops below 101 degrees. They encouraged producers to use colostrum to warm calves internally when necessary. Berger and Waecher-Mead said the understand of risk factors is essential for producers.


