ISSUE: Debt limit, energy prices, train derailments

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min.

AIRED: 4/2/23, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Phil Kerpen of American Commitment discussed the U.S. National debt limit and progress made in negotiations as well as barriers to an agreement. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth talked about the Lower Energy Cost Act and its attempt to fight anti-domestic energy policies of the Biden administration. The bill provides for development, exploration importation and exportation of U.S. energy resources. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed new regulations proposed after recent train derailments.

ISSUE: U.S. Sovereignty being threatened by WHO

PROGRAM: Family Talk

DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 4/3/23 (part 1) 7:30 am and 11:30 pm; 4/4/23 (part 2) 7:30 am and 11:30 am

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and guest Michelle Bachmann, former U.S. Congresswoman from Minnesota, discussed the dangers of a proposed agreement that would potentially surrender U.S. Decision-making authority to the World Health Organization, with the stated purpose of protecting people from health threats worldwide. Bachmann expressed the dangers and implications of this proposal, as well as how it could impact our freedoms as Americans. Bachmann encouraged U.S. Citizens to speak out and reach out to U.S. Officials, expressing the concerns the agreement would have.

ISSUE: Eminent domain misuse, Virginia U.S. Senate race

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henery and Scott Parkinson of Club For Growth discussed the U.S. Senate race in the key state of Virginia, where two Republicans could effect the balance of the Senate. Eric Boehm discussed the misuse of eminent domain in Tennessee, as property owners challenge the state's just compensation and fair market value rules, saying they are harming property owners and not giving them a fair price.

ISSUE: Maximizing grazing cereal rye and other cold weather small cereals for cow-calf operations

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 15 min.

AIRED: 4/15/23, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger and Mary Drewnowski, Neb. Extension Beef System Specialist, discussed the need for optimizing performance of cattle with high nutritional requirements to keep grass from becoming overly mature. Drewnowski says producers should begin grazing when plants are 5-6 inches high and keep maximum height at 8-10 inches. Drewnowski says the most common mistake producers make when spring grazing small cereals is letting the grass grow ahead of the cattle. It is important to increase stocking density as spring progresses to ensure the cattle keep up with the rapid forage growth.

ISSUE: Economic recession, debt ceiling, threat of nuclear weapons in Ukraine

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min.

AIRED: 4/30/23, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and E.J. Antoni of the Heritage Foundation discussed the potential for economic recession and the drastic measures that need to be made to avoid it. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the potential passage of a debt ceiling increase and the impact of not passing and passing the increase. Dr. Paul Kengor of the Institute for Faith and Freedom at Grove City College discussed the regional and global implications and dangers of Russia's potential use of nuclear weapons in Ukraine.

ISSUE: Conversion to all electric vehicles for U.S. military, student loan forgiveness program.

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Myron Bell of the Competitive Enterprise Institute discussed the proposal to convert the U.S. military to all electric vehicles and the problems this could cause and the economic cost to U.S. taxpayers. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed aspects of President Biden's student loan forgiveness program, which is on hold and being reviewed by the U.S. Supreme Court and awaiting full implementation. Jonathan Williams of the American Legislation Exchange Council discussed the national debt limit crisis and attempts to raise the debt limit.

ISSUE: Preparing for winter bull management

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger and Kacie McCarthy, UNL Cow-Calf Specialist, talked about how producers can prepare to deal with cold weather management, enduring that producer's bulls have appropriate shelter and feed to progress through harsh winters for future success in the spring and moving into breeding season. McCarthy says evaluating and observing tissue damage can help producers identify bulls that need time to heal or allows time to cull the bull and find a new bull prior to breeding season.

ISSUE: Kids cultural anxiety and mental health

DESCRIPTION: Dr. Tim Clinton and guest Dr. Kathy Koch, founder of Celebrate Kids, Inc., discussed the growing mental health issues that are resulting in a rise of kids facing depression and anxiety. Koch says the issues need to be recognized and addressed by parents and other adults that can help them to have a positive outlook for the future and to recognize the great value and potential that possess. Koch says parents must not abandon their responsibility to help guide and instruct kids and point them to professionals who can provide assistance to them when parents feel overwhelmed by the mental health challenges kids are facing from multiple pressures.

ISSUE: New regulations on coal and gas powered power plants, preparation for emergencies

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Daren Bakst from the Competitive Enterprise Institute discussed the Biden Administration efforts to impose new and more costly emission rules on coal and gas-fired power plants and their impact on power customers dependent on reasonably priced electricity. Jonathan Bydlak of the R Street Institute talked about the federal government preparing for emergencies because of increasing threats of weather and other types of emergencies. Dr. Paul Kengor from the Institute for Faith and Freedom at Grove City College discussed the entry of Robert F. Kennedy, Jr.'s impact on the Democratic Presidential race.

ISSUE: Packing small grain silage

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 15 min

AIRED: 5/21/23, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger and guests Mary Drewnoski, Extension Beef Systems Specialist, Jenny Rees, Extension Cropping Systems Specialist, Ben Beckman, Extension Educator and a panel discussed the importance of packing small grain silage when it is too wet and the mistakes producers often make. They advised producers have wilted the crop before packing because the forage on top of the swath began to dry out, the forage underneath remained wet. Producers need to consider weather conditions such as wind speed, temperature, and the relative humidity and its affect on the rate of field drying. They urged producers to diligent in getting the moisture content right.

Scott Parkinson of the Club for Growth discussed the importance of parents having more control over their children's education. Colin Hanna of Let Freedom Ring USA discussed why the issue of school choice will continue to be an important vote moving issue in political campaigns.

ISSUE: Pornography and its destructive impact on families

DESCRIPTION: Dr. James Dobson and Nancy Blake, author of the book "Betrayed", discussed Blake's experience of having her marriage and family torn apart by her husband's addiction to pornography. She discussed why this addiction is as addictive and destructive as any drug or alcohol and is much harder to detect. She discussed the fact that as the addiction grows the addict becomes more and more isolated and withdrawn from meaningful family and marriage involvement and Blake urges those caught up in the addiction to get help before it is too late. She also discussed the shame and guilt that often the spouse deals with in trying to understand the whys of this addiction.

ISSUE: Health care issues poll, state-related hospitals performing gender reassignment surgery

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Phil Kerpen of American Commitment discussing a new poll on health care issues in America, showing the majority of Americans are concerned about escalating costs and diminishing access to health care, but do not think the government should fully ensure health care. Andy Roth of the State Freedom Caucus Network discussed the controversy surrounding state-related university hospitals performing gender reassignment surgery on minor children, which most states ban. Eric Boehm of Reason magazine talked about the recent debt limit bill, suggesting it will add more people to the nation's welfare rolls.

ISSUE: Controlling leafy spurge on grazing land

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator and Ben Beckman discussed ways to control leafy spurge as an important assignment for producers, as the noxious weed is especially noticeable in early June. Berger and Beckman says, while herbicides and control methods are vital, mapping or marking infestations is one of the most important steps. Beckman says this makes spraying of patches of leafy spurge easier and ensures dormant seed that is late germinating, or a stray plant that has been missed. They discussed herbicide options that can be used to fight growth of leafy spurge.

Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the conservative disagreement over the Railroad Safety Act, which would put further regulations on the railroad industry and drive up their costs of operation, ultimately raising costs to consumers and adding to inflationary pressure on the U.S. economy.
