

ISSUE: Protecting middle school children from internet and social media dangers

PROGRAM: Family Talk

DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 9/1/23, 7:30 am and 11:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Dr. Brenda Hunter, PHD and author of "From Santa to Sexting", a book co-authored with her daughter Kristen Blair, discussed the need for parents to protect middle school children from the dangers of the internet and social media's influence on this particularly vulnerable age group, who are seeking approval and experience self image issues. Hunter and Blair urged parents to learn how to recognize the warning signs before your child's digital life becomes a problem, danger or addiction.

ISSUE: Abolishing the Department of Education, federal budget and growing federal debt

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min.

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Jonathan Butcher of the Heritage Foundation discussed the GOP calls to abolish the Department of Education, not only as a budget savings but due to the questions related to the need for the department since education issues are better handled by states and local school districts, rather than the federal government. Scott Parkinson from the Club for Growth talked about the federal budget battle that threatens U.S. economic health. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed Republican presidential candidate Nikki Haley's calling out her party as responsible for much of the federal debt and the call for a more conservative view on budgets and spending.

ISSUE: Latest employment numbers, the effect of downgrading of U.S. credit.

DESCRIPTION: Lowman Henry and Sean Higgins from Competitive Enterprise Institute discussed the latest unemployment/ employment numbers, showing unemployment at 3.8 percent and its effect on jobs and the overall economy, still reeling from inflationary growth. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the downgrade of U.S. credit rating and how it will effect green energy subsidies and the overall rethinking of the emphasis on EEG issues. Jonathan Williams from the American Legislative Exchange Council talked about people moving from high tax states to low tax states and its effect on the politics and economies of these states.

ISSUE: Increasing cow values and tax planning

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator, discussed the increasing value of cows and how producers can stay informed on how to maximize profitability. Berger says currently weigh up cows are bringing \$1.10 per pound and young bred heifers and cows pushing \$2,500- \$3,00 per head, reflecting dramatic rise in prices. Berger advised producers to do their tax calculations and know the most wise way to plan ahead. Berger says selling home bred cows when cows when prices are high and replacing them with home raised heifer calves could be profitable in the near term.

ISSUE: Downgrading of U.S. bond rating, FDA new food labeling regulation

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Keith Hall of the Mercatus Center at George Mason University discussed the economic impact of the downgrading of the federal government's bond rating, as well as the potential impact on consumer credit in the U.S. Scott Parkinson of the Club for Growth talked about the latest indictment of former President Donald Trump and its impact on the Republican primary race for president. Eric Boehm of Reason magazine discussed new FDA food labeling regulations that remove vitamin A and C and add vitamin D and potassium. Serving size and calories are also now required to be more prominently displayed.

ISSUE: Heat stress on cattle

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 15 min.

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Educator, Jesse Fulton, Director of Nebraska Beef Quality Assurance and Ruth Woiwode, Animal Care and Handling Extension Educator discussed the issue of heat stress on cattle and what producers can do to address the problem. Producers should be watching for limited or reduced feed intake, increased respiration or panting, and cattle crowding around water tanks as signs of heat stress. Beef Quality Assurance guidelines suggest producers should try to refrain from handling or transporting cattle between 11 am and pm, the hottest hours of the day. They also said producers should provide additional water and space around water tanks, reduce the amount of feed delivered in the morning to help lower the heat level, starting the morning before a heat event occurs. They also recommended the use of sprinklers on lower humidity day.

ISSUE: Problems and challenges for single moms

DESCRIPTION: Dr. Tim Clinton, Dr. James Dobson and Angela Thomas- Pharr, author of the books, "Do You Think I'M Beautiful" and "My Single Mom Life", discussed the challenges of being a single mom with four young children. Pharr said the pressure to quickly find a man to marry or to help raise the children should be avoided and help should be sought through family, church groups and other assistance that is available through community programs. She also stressed the importance of trying to create as "normal" of an environment as possible for the children.

ISSUE: Getting help to countries after natural disasters and economic crisis around the world

PROGRAM: Life Issues

DESCRIPTION: Host Don Wight and Patrick Kline, President of Vision Beyond Borders discussed the need in many countries for basic supplies, medicines and assistance in impoverished countries and especially after catastrophic natural disasters. VBB provide food, clothing medicines and Bibles in many parts of the world, many of which are closed to missionaries. VBB and ministry partners have delivered many forms of assistance recently to Turkey following the massive earthquake and to Cuba, a country that is facing ongoing poverty and poor living conditions, needing medicines and basic supplies.

ISSUE: Inflation impact, congressional investigations, student loan forgiveness plan

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Patrick Horan from the Mercatus Center at George Mason University discussed the new inflation numbers and Federal Reserve inflation fighting policies that appear to be fueling inflation, as consumers are hit with high gas, grocery and housing prices, with no end in sight. Scott Parkinson of Club For Growth discussed the on-going congressional investigations. Colin Hanna from Let Freedom Ring discussed the problems with the Biden Administration's student loan forgiveness program.

ISSUE: Summer pneumonia in calves

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 15 min.

AIRED: 7/23/23, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger, Nebraska Extension Beef Educator and Halden Clark, DVMS at Great Plains Veterinary Educational Center discussed the need for cattle operators to stay alert for summer pneumonia in calves. Producers should look for signs of the conditions, such as listless calves with droopy ears and high body temperature. Producers should contact their veterinarian with questions regarding the best approach to vaccinating calves as well as treatment procedures for calves. They said that if a calf dies they should work with their veterinarian to make sure the death is in fact pneumonia and to rule out other causes, and to protect other calves.

ISSUE: World food supply, upcoming Presidential debate, federal deficit

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and George Beebe of the Quincy Institute for Responsible Statecraft discussed the global economic and food supply problems resulting from Russia's decision to cancel the Black Sea Grain Initiative. Scott Parkinson of Club For Growth talked about the upcoming Presidential debate and the candidates participating. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine discussed the economic impact of the growing federal deficit on the U.S. and world economy.

ISSUE: The impact of living with an alcoholic parent or relative while growing up

PROGRAM: Family Talk

DESCRIPTION: Dr. James Dobson, Dr. Curt Grayson and an anonymous panel discussed the traumatic and far-reaching effects that alcoholism inflicted on them as children and how it continued to effect them in their adult life. The hosts encouraged the listeners to reach out for help in through counseling and support groups, such as a group Dr. Grayson started for adult children of alcoholics in a church in Fullerton, CA. Grayson also shared from the book he co-authored, "Creating A Safe Place".

ISSUE: Growing national debt, U.S. Senate races

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min.

AIRED: 7/2/23, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and David Ditch of the Heritage Foundation discussed the impact the growing national debt is having on the US economy and the inflationary pressures it is creating. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the important US Senate races in Montana and Arizona and their possible impact on the balance of power in the Senate. Dr. Paul Kongor of the Institute for Faith and Freedom discussed the growing threat of nuclear conflict with Russia.

ISSUE: Water quantity and quality for cattle health and performance

PROGRAM: Beefwatch

DURATION: 15 min.

AIRED: 7/2/23, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger and Troy Walz, Nebraska Extension Educators, discussed the importance of having water quantity and quality for cattle health and performance, especially in hot weather and in drought conditions. They discussed that cattle need 2 gallons of water per body "weight per day. Bulls and dry cows need 1-1.5 gallons per 100 pounds per day. They also say producers should consistently check water for nitrates, sulfates, and blue-green algae if a problem is suspected. Berger and Walz pointed out that nitrates are an elevated concern in drought conditions.

ISSUE: How to change and conquer addictions

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Becky Tirabassi, author and CEO of Burning Hearts. Tirabassi shared her journey out of addiction, which started by her self discovery and willingness to admit that she was addicted to alcohol at age 21 and reached out for help. She said the addictions people struggle with are difficult to admit, especially for Christians because of the stigma that is often attached to addictions. She also encouraged people to reach out to people who may be addicted and offer to help them find the help they need.

ISSUE: Student loan forgiveness, impact of "Bidenomics"

Scott Parkinson of the Club for Growth discussed the effects of the Biden Administration's economic policies and the rising debt and inflationary pressure being put of families and businesses, policies that could lead to recession and the weakening of the U.S. standing and influence on the world economic picture.
