ISSUE: Summer pneumonia in spring born calves

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 20 min AIRED: 7/13/19, 1:35 PM

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, extension beef educator, interviewed veterinarian Dr. Halden Clark about the problem of summer pneumonia and spring born beef calves and how to diagnose and treat summer pneumonia. Dr. Clark discussed ways to identify the disease and current methods to treat

infected calves.

ISSUE: Forage for cattle grazing.

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger, extension educator, discussed annual forage production for July and August planting with Darren Redfern, extension forage and crop residue specialist and Mary Drewnowski, Nebraska extension beef system specialist. The guests pointed out that when planted in July, sorghum sudangrasses can produce 3-4 tons per acre. They also discussed grazing plans for Fall and Winter.

ISSUE: U.S. Supreme Court gerrymandering, DOE regulations of dishwashers
