## KLWDKWCF ISSUES/PROGRAMS- 2ND QUARTER 2022

ISSUE: Nuclear deal with Iran, Biden's proposed budget, flat tax

PROGRAM: American Radio Journa

DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 4/3/22, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and James Phillips of the Heritage Foundation discussed the nuclear deal negotiations with Iran and its impact on the safety of Israel and the U.S. They also discussed the problem of Russia being included in the negotiations. Scott Parkinson from the Club For Growth discussed President Biden's budget proposal as well as concerns about the pressure the mounting budget deficits will put on the U.S. economy. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked about studies showing the National Institutes of Health were slow to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact it had on the nation's health. Jonathan Williams of the American Legislative Exchange Council discussed the potential impact on numerous states that are adopting a flat tax.

ISSUE: the COVID-19 Preparedness Act, Supreme Court Justice confirmation

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 4/10/22, 10 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Dr. Joel Zinberg from the Competitive Enterprise Institute discussed the proposed new COVID-19 Preparedness Act. The plan is being proposed by the Biden administration to protect against and treat COVID-19. The plan also proposes to educate on and prepare for new variants, prevent educational and economic shutdowns and continue to vacinate the population of the world. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the implications of confirming a new Supreme Court Justice. Colin Hanna discussed the Biden administration actions in dealing with the Ukraine invasion.

ISSUE: Dealing with conflict in marriage

PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 4/14/22, 7:30 am and 11:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Dr. Tim Clinton and Shunti Feldhahn, author of the books "For Womebn Only, For Men Only" and "The Kindness Challenge" discussed issues that lead to marital conflict. Feldhahn says most squabbles are not about money or sex, but are from spouses' different fears and values that often lead to resentment, bruised egos and feelings of rejection. Feldhahn encouraged spouses to take time to openly discuss their issues rather than react with fear, pride and resentment.

ISSUE: Response to drought and its effect on patures and cattle

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min. AIRED: 4/24/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger and Ben Bekman, Nebraska Extension Educators, discussed the short term and long term impacts drought conditions are having on Cow-Calf operations. They also discussed the importance of having drought plans that may need to be implemented to reduce stocking rates and limit the potential for overgrazing, which is hard on plants. Bekman also urged producers to maintain the battle against invasive weed species and to not return to normal grazing practices after a rain, which can lead to overgrazing. Bekman and Henry also stressed the importance of having a drought plan in place.

ISSUE: Staying healthy over 50 PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 4/21/22, 7:30 am and 11:30 pm (part 1); 4/22/22, 7:30 am and 11:30 pm (part 2)

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Dr. Walt Larimore, author of "Fit Over 50" discussed the importance of being proactive in staying healthy after the age of 50. Larimore explained that life is like a car with four wheels. If one of them goes flat, the whole car wobbles. Larimore went on to explain that the four wheels relates to four health wheels that need to be addressed: spiritual, emotional, relational and physical. He says we must nourish and protect all four aspects of our life, especially as we get older Dobson and Larimore pointed out that most often people make the mistake of only paying attention to one or two aspects and misss the fact that God has created us as an integrated being.

ISSUE: Social media takeover of Twitter, Federal reserve Board of Governor's new addition, slavery

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Jessica Melugin from the Competitive Enterprise Institute discussed the potential takeover of social media giant Twitter by Elon Musk and its impact of the media outlet and the debate over free speech that has become an issue for all social media companies. Scott Parkinson of Club For Growth discussed the impact of a new radical addition to the Federal Reserve Board of Governors and its impact on interest rates and future policy. Eric Boehm of Reason magazine discussed why courts should have power over public health officials, especially in the case of restrictions and lock down decisions. Colin Hanna of Let Freedon Ring, USA talked about the issue of slavery reparations and its potential impact on the unity and economy of our nation.

ISSUE: The problem of aging PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 5/11/22 7:30 am and 11:30 pm (part 1); 5/12/22 7:30 am and 11:30 pm (part 2)

DESCRIPTION: Dr. James Dobson and Kenneth Cooper, founder of the Cooper Institute, a research and education nonprofit and "the father of aerobics", discussed the factors that speed up the aging process and emphasized the lasting impact of a wholesome diet along with exercise. Cooper explained that a sedentary lifestyle and unrestricted diet choices are fuel to the aging process. Cooper also discussed the need for Christians to live out the teaching of 1 Corinthians 6, that our body is the temple of the Holy Spirit.

ISSUE: Protecting farms and ranches from wildfires

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min. AIRED: 5/15/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Aaron Berger, Randy Saner and Rob Eirich, University of Nebraska Extension Educators, discussed steps that need to be taken to prevent wildfires on farms and ranches. Steps include installing smoke detectors, having an escape plan, keeping irrigation sources free of combustible equipment material, keeping farmstead areas clear of weeds, grass and other debris, evacuate animals if there is time and make sure to close gates to prohibit access to dangerous areas.

ISSUE: Cost of Medicare for all, baby formula shortage

PROGRAM: American Radio Journal

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Charles Biahous of the Mercatus Center at George Mason University discussed the cost and economic effect on the U.S. economy a proposed Medicare-For-All plan would place on already highly pressure economy. Scott Parkinson of the Club Fopr Growth discussed the U.S. Senate race results in North Carolina and Pennsylvania will have on the mid term elections in November. Eric Boehm of Reason Magazine talked about the Biden Administration plan to address the baby formula shortage as well as how the shortage impacts families.

ISSUE: Cow-Calf operations preparing for breeding season

PROGRAM: Beefwatch DURATION: 15 min. AIRED: 5/29/22, 10:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Aaron Berger and Wayde Pickinpaugh, University of Nebraska extension educators, talked about the thing cow-calf producers should be doing to prepare for breeding season. Berger and Pickinpaugh emphasized the importance of having a breeding season plan in place,. Making sure cattle have proper nutrition after calving so they will be ready for breeding 50-60 days after calving and should consider vaccinating females for bovine viral diarrhea virus and other viruses prior to breeding to obtain a healthy pregnancy. They also explained the factors to consider in the bull selection process for breeding.

ISSUE: Managing family finances

PROGRAM: Family Talk DURATION: 26 min.

AIRED: 6/7/22, 730 am and 1130 pm

DESCRIPTION: Host Dr. James Dobson and Larry Burkett, former host of radio show "Money Matters and author of over 70 books, discussed the importance of managing family finances in a God honoring way that reflects good stewardship. Burkett emphasized the value of having a budget plan and actually following it as a way to financial freedom. Burkett says that finances are an important part of the life of discipleship and that there is a reason two thirds of all Jesus' parables address the issue of money.

ISSUE: Addictions, marriage and family struggles

PROGRAM: Life Issues DURATION: 30 min. AIRED: 6/12/22, 1030 pm

DESCRIPTION: Don Wight and Steve Arterburn of New Life Ministries, host of call-in show New Life Radio and the author of "Every Man's Battle", "Healing Strength", "Toxic Faith" and many other books and devotionals, discussed the growing pressures our society is putting on marriages and families. Arterburn also discussed the problem of addictions as well as the potential threat to marriage fidelity that social media is posing in our day. Arterburn says married couples need to stay connected and communicating with each other so that they are not lured into social media relationships that fill the void in a couple's marriage. He stressed the importance of creating a safe and open line of communication between couples and families to improve the quality of the home.

DESCRIPTION: Host Lowman Henry and Phil Kerpen from American Commitment discussed Biden Administration's proposed carbon tax and its potential impact on consumers, business and energy producers. Kerpen says the impact of consumers would be immediately felt at the gas pump, adding 90 cents a gallon to the price of fuel. Scott Parkinson of the Club For Growth discussed the attempted assassination of Supreme Court Justice Brent Kavanaugh and the need for security for the justices and for laws protecting them need to enforced. Phil Rossetti discussed the potential misuse of the Defense Production Act to provide increased production of baby formula in the US. Roseertti questioned the use of this act for this purpose, since it is designed by FEMA to be in military or homeland security threats or in national emergencies that threaten the US.

DESCRIPTION: Host Don Wight and Trish Simonson, a leader in the Campbell County Suicide Prevention Council and author of the book, "The Road Back- Finding Your Way After Losing A Child To Suicide", and a parent who has lost a teenage son to suicide discussed the ways to help people contemplating suicide. Simonson pointed out that Wyoming has the highest suicide rate in the nation. She emphasized the need for families, peers and Christian leaders to be willing to reach out to those who may be talking about or showing the signs that often lead to suicide attempts. Simonson says often expressing to someone who is talking about or showing signs of having suicidal thoughts how valuable and important they are in God's eyes and to their their friends and families can be a way to get someone to talk with a trusted friend, family member or a professional Christian counselor.
