ISSUES COVERED: California Water Shortage

PROGRAM: “Rush Hour”

LENGTH: 60 minutes

DATE/TIME AIRED: 4/8 @6:00pm

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: With California facing one of the most severe droughts on record, Governor Brown declared a drought State of Emergency in January and directed state officials to take all necessary actions to prepare for water shortages. The program guest was the chief editor of Sing Tao Newspaper Mr. KC Chang who talked California water shortage problems and the future challenges for Chinese community.

ISSUE/S COVERED: Former Taiwan Politician Ms. Hsieh Chi-Ta

The program guests were two commentaries to discuss the cyber bullying, Mr. Howei Yu and Mr. Max Shei.

ISSUE/S COVERED: The Crime Rate after Proposition 47

County, narcotics arrests are down but property crime has risen since Prop. 47 was passed in last November. According to this result, the program guest

ISSUE/S COVERED: Asian-American Groups Sue Harvard University

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: A coalition of Asian-American groups filed a federal complaint against Harvard University on Friday alleging the school engaged in "systemic and continuous discrimination" against Asian Americans during its admissions process. More than 60 Chinese, Indian, Korean and Pakistani groups came together for the complaint, which was filed with the civil rights offices at the justice and education departments. They are calling for an investigation into Harvard and other Ivy League institutions that they say should stop using racial quotas or racial balancing in admission. The program guests were two volunteers who helped organize the coalition Mr. Alex Chang and Mr. Pan Jan-Gueng talked about this lawsuit.

According to this case, the program discussed Chinese spy cases in the past of 10 years and how it reflects in Chinese-Americans working in high tech industry from this negative news. The program guests were two high tech people Dr. Shreng Shian-Ming who works for Utah University of medical research department and Mr. Howei Yu who works for Amgen Co and in charge of Bio research data.

The program guest attorney Mr. Shown Chou analyzed this case's development and cheating test in school's situation.

ISSUE/S COVERED: China's Stock Market Likes a Crazy Casino

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: China's stock market has often been called a casino, with share prices bearing little connection to underlying economic conditions. But while the market has strayed from growth trends in the past, its divergence over the past few months has reached new extremes. Economic growth in the first quarter fell to 7%, the slowest annual figure in six years, but stocks have more than doubled in value since the middle of 2014. The program guest was Mr. Jin-Wei Jreng who was an economist and familiar with China's structure and policy. He weighted in the booming China's stock market and future risks.
