ISSUES COVERED: Taiwan Missile Mishap

PROGRAM: “Rush Hour”

LENGTH: 60 minutes

DATE/TIME AIRED: 7/7 @6:00pm

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: A Hsiung Feng III missile was accidentally launched from a Republic of China “Taiwan” Navy vessel from water off Kaohsiung towards China before hitting the Taiwanese fishing boat. This incident killed 1 person and injuring 3, and caused a lot of chaos situation between China and Taiwan. According to this news, the program guests were two different parties’ political commentaries. Every year in early spring time, the urine of prepubescent school boys preferably under 10 years is collected and boiled with eggs and sold for 1.50 yuan, around twice the price of a regular boiled egg. Based on this "local intangible cultural heritage food", the program guest was Singtao Newspaper editor Mr. Harry Lin who weighted in this cultural food and compared some other unusual food items in the world.
