**ISSUES COVERED:** Repeal Gasoline Tax Proposition

**PROGRAM:** “Rush Hour”

**GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:** A fight to repeal the state gas tax hike that went into effect last November could be on its way to the ballot box. Supporters of the gas tax repeal effort say they've gathered more than 940,000 signatures statewide - surpassing the requirement of 584,000 signatures to get the measure on the November ballot.
