ISSUES COVERED: Nobel Peace Prize winner Liu Xiaobo

PROGRAM: "Rush Hour"

LENGTH: 60 minutes

DATE/TIME AIRED: 7/6 @6:00pm

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Liu Xiaobo, one of China's most famous pro-democracy advocates and political prisoners was moved from prison to hospital because he got late-stage liver cancer.
