ISSUES COVERED: Recall California Governor

PROGRAM: "Rush Hour"

LENGTH: 60 minutes

DATE/TIME AIRED: 10/16 @6:00pm

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Two efforts to recall California Gov. Gavin Newsom, a member of the Democratic Party, were launched in August 2019. Both recalls were approved for circulation in September 2019. Newsom was elected as California's governor in 2018 with 61.9% of the vote. According to this recall action, the program discussed the recall development and consequences for California. The program guest was Mr. Fisher Yu who weighted in California recall history and Governor Newsom's public approval rate.

ISSUE/S COVERED: Should California Businesses Pay More in Property Taxes?

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The SAT and a rival college entrance exam, the ACT, were intended to level the college admissions process a bit by offering an objective test that would place all students, regardless of what school they attend, on the same footing. But it hasn't exactly worked out that way. Private test prep has become a big business, with fees that often run into the thousands of dollars per student. More affluent students can also afford to take the test multiple times in search of higher scores. It's no wonder that test scores are strongly correlated with family income. The program discussed the value of standard text for SAT and ACT. The program guests were Mrs. Shian-Jie Meng believed it's time to abandon the tests, and Dr. Chuan-Shrng Ba claimed without the standard test couldn't evaluate the students' academic achievements.

Elizabeth Warren has been at the forefront in her bid to become the 2020 Democratic presidential nominee. For marriage-based green cards filed within the United States, application fees would increase by 56%, from \$1,760 to \$2,750.
