ISSUES COVERED: Coronavirus

PROGRAM: "Rush Hour"

LENGTH: 60 minutes

DATE/TIME AIRED: 4/6 @6:00pm

GUEST/S AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The program interviewed two healthcare workers, the nurse Mr. Jin Jiun and the emergency physician Dr. Peter Grnen who worked for L.A county hospital and shared the latest of Coronavirus situation and challenges in the first line of saving lives.
