WUSQ-FM Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WUSQ-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Awareness: Oscar Cerritos Mendoza tells us about the need size of our valley's HIV+ population, current treatment options, and how to get tested free and anonymously. He also shined light on the work ARE is doing to find Housing for HIV+ people in the valley.
- Cyber Security: Dir. of Cyber Security at APPLE FCU Larry Larsen dropped in to discuss the many dangers we face digitally when shopping online during the holidays, and gave us many tips on how to avoid identity theft and other dangers online.
- Early Childhood Education: Jill Williams, Executive Director of Healthy Families joined us to discuss the impact Healthy Families has had on our valley's young parents in making sure children hit their milestones, and helping parents learn best parenting practices.
- Emergency Preparedness: Topics covered included the increased need for blood and exactly why it seems we're always in a crisis for blood; also what that one pint of donated blood can do. Community Engagement officer Leslie Caliva also shared what our local Red Cross' needs are heading into 2019, as their volunteer staff shrank in 2018. She also discussed how we can all be more prepared for natural disasters.
- Emergency Assistance: The Valley Assistance Network's executive director, Jennifer Hall joined us to discuss the services they offer to our ALCIE population...ALICE being an acronym for what used to be termed the "working poor." She shed light on the free classes they offer on budgeting, finding help to fund further education, and more.
- **Healthcare:** Margaret Clark the Head Volunteer at our free Dental Clinic talked to us about the deep need for the clinic to continue its work, and it's current limitations. In October, which is Breast Cancer Awareness month, we asked Aimee Neuer from our local American Cancer Society to catch us up on Breast Cancer, self-examination, mammograms, and local diagnosis options.
- Homelessness: We went on location to the Winchester Rescue Mission to talk with Executive Director Brandon Thomas, and see what our local homeless face every day. We discussed the mental illness component, the affect opioids have had in our community, and how valley residents are rallying to their aid.

• Hunger Prevention: Nancy Mango came to tell us how her non-profit Bright Futures partners with local school systems, trying to identify students who are secretly and not-so-secretly living in abject poverty, or may be homeless. Then they step in to provide assistance in the form of meals and school supplies, even clothing to those students. We also discussed how local churches and businesses are supporting the effort.
