WUSQ-FM Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WUSQ-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Adoption: Amber Brown Adoption Services worker of Lutheran Family Services fielded listeners' questions and concerns about alternative legal ways couple can adopt in Virginia and West Virginia.
- Awareness: Our local United Way's Elise Stinedollar came to inform us about the findings from their latest Community Assessment Report. She helped coordinate the project, which is done every three years, to determine where the needs are greatest in our community. This document helps focus the United Way's fund distributions each year, which determines how our listeners donations are allocated, and which non-profits can expect to be prioritized, according to need.
- **Bullying:** Stephanie Heishman-Littman Sexual Assault Services coordinator spoke to us about their teen outreach program, focusing on positive responses to cyberbullying. Also on ways teens can deflect pressure of sexting, and the consequences. This was a two part program, with the second part focused on speaking to parents about how to discover if their student is being bullied and how to respond to it, also to make them aware of how widespread the problem sexting has become.
- Child Safety: Kelly Bober, Executive director of the Child Safety Center spoke to our listeners about their plans to expand the center physically, which will allow them to expand their services to both children and families who are victims of abuse. The center is already on the front line in its rapid response to shelter children discovered in abusive situations here in the valley. Expanding the center will help them expand capacity and keep more local kids safe.
- Domestic Violence: Rusty Holland, Executive Director of Concern Hotline normally talks to us about the number of suicide prevention calls the agency handles in the valley. Not this time. Recently in our area there has been an alarming rise in calls involving domestic disputes, often coupled with opioid use/addiction, and he wanted to make us all aware.
- Drug Addiction Prevention: CEO Leslie Jones also came to our studios to inform our listeners about the rising opioid epidemic. Nationally, the rate of opioid overdoses has risen 500%, the number is slightly larger in the valley. Clean, Inc's main focus is to prevent local teens and tweens from experimenting with drugs, and parents can use them as a resource.
- Early Childhood Education: Shannon Triplett, Family Coordinator was thrilled to discuss their new full day program. Formerly the agency could be open to help low income families' preschoolers for half a day. She explained to us how the program works, how it's funded, and how our lower income listeners can take advantage of their services.

- Fundraising: Brenda Ernst, Executive Director discusses an all-day fundraiser for the disabled in our community. This is a day-long event that raises money and awareness for disabled people living in the Shenandoah Valley. It's their largest fundraiser of the year, and she explained they use the money raised to install ramps, lifts, and convert cars, kitchens, baths, etc. for local people with disabilities so they can live a more independent life.
- Senior Care: Cathy Galvin came to our show after headlines brought Meals on Wheels into the spotlight in our nation, and here at home. She explained who they are, how they are funded, and how they serve a very important role in our seniors' lives. She fielded listeners' questions and gave us a strong understanding of their impact locally.
- Volunteering: Volunteer coordinator Leslie Caliva discussed the Red Cross' continuing role in our community as they celebrate their 100th year here. Elise Stinedollar, coordinator of the United Way's Day of Caring, talked with us about the rapid growth the event has seen, year after year. Its impact is remarkable; it remains our area's largest one-day volunteering event, with over 1,100 local citizens taking the day to do charity work of all kinds throughout our community.
