WUSQ-FM Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WUSQ-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Child Development: Rudija Powell, teacher, explains their unique approach to preschool for the impoverished children in our area, and how it's improving their acclamation and performance in our schools.
- Education: Lisa Giesler, the executive Director of Winchester Day Preschool, informed our listeners of the dire need for quality preschool for the disadvantaged families in our area. The school has a unique approach for children gearing up for kindergarten, which has shown outstanding results. Amy Pearson, volunteer at Reading Road Show discussed the new, broader reach of their touring book-bus into more rural areas, and how listeners there can take advantage of it. Jeff Perkins, a volunteer at Blue Ridge Educational Foundation explains a new program, which provides part time or full-time individualized services for students with a wide range of needs and abilities.
- Fundraising: After a larger than expected number of children enrolled for their after school programs, which act as an educational day care-gap, Sherry Mayo, director of the Youth Development Center discussed their attempt to keep the facility running, to continue to provide the working poor with an affordable and safe place for their young students to be after school.
- Healthcare: Ex Director Pam Murphy discussed the day to day struggle of running a free clinic with expanding areas of health care, which now includes dental and mental health services, while the numbers of doctors and other medical professionals is dwindling in our area.
- Homelessness: Board President Dan Coig discusses the WATTS program's success. WATTS stands for Winchester Area Thermal Shelter, a temporary safe space shelter program for the Homeless in our area during the winter.
- Health and Fitness: Various celebrities and medical professionals discussed advances in breast cancer research, including new DNA discoveries, and healthy lifestyle changes that can help prevent certain types of breast cancers.
- Poverty: Rotarian Erik Beatley informed our listeners about the shockingly large (and growing) number of children here who live in extreme poverty, and have no winter coats. He also discussed the Rotary's Coats for Kids program and how it works to provide over 750 local children with new, warm winter coats.
- Senior Care: As our local population is an aging one, Jane Boutnik, ex director of the Adult Care Center, explains the services her organization provides and the growing need for Adult Care. She also discussed the effectiveness of new art and music-therapy programs.
- Substance Abuse: With heroin overdose deaths in our area rising nearly exponentially, Robin Burroughs, Board member of the Substance Abuse Coalition made us aware of their efforts to educate the public about opioids, including monthly lectures, and the new addition of a specialized drug court in our local judicial center.
- Volunteering: Executive Director Brenda Ernst, of Access independence, described the needs we have locally for qualified volunteers for their many programs for the

disabled, from tutoring to training people with a newly-acquired disability on how to navigate insurance.
