### Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- B. Earth Day 2018.

- E. Cal State Parks.

### Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

#### A. Santa Barbara Bucket Brigade:

When the mountain came down on Montecito during the disastrous mudslide, Abe Powell rose up and organized the Santa Barbara Bucket Brigade – a grassroots organization of locals who volunteer their time to literally help dig their friends and neighbors in Montecito out of the mud. We talked about the inspiration for the Bucket Brigade, how it works, and how it's evolved from a rag-tag group of people doing what they can to the well-oiled machine it is. Ran April 1, 22, May 6, & June 3, 2018 at 8am.

#### B. Earth Day 2018:

The Earth Day Festival is a nearly 50 year old institution here in Santa Barbara, and Cultivate Events has been a production partner for the festival for the last 5 years. Katy Herschfeldt joined us to talk about the festival with a focus on the Homegrown Roots section of the festival, the main part Cultivate Events organizes. We talked about the importance of local food and gardens, and how the festival is working towards becoming a zero-waste event. Ran April 8 & 15, 2018 at 8am.

#### C. Santa Barbara Recycling Pt. 1:

Recycling should be easy, right? Paper, plastic, aluminum, just toss it in the blue bin. That's what Kevin, KJEE's accountant and (for lack of a better term) recycling police thought, but then greasy pizza boxes entered the picture. We had a dilemma, our very core beliefs about recycling were shaken, and only one person could help us out – Jaime Crowley, the real recycling police. Jaime explained what can and can't be recycled, gave us some simple, easy to remember rules about what goes in the recycling and what doesn't, and finally cleared up the whole greasy pizza box debacle. #### D. Santa Barbara Recycling Pt. 2:

After clearing up what can and can not be recycled, Jaime Crowley of Marborg explains what exactly happens to our recycling after it's picked up. Understanding the recycling process can help people to better understand why some things can't be recycled, like wet or contaminated paper products, and can hopefully encourage people to be more mindful about their recycling./ Lastly, she leaves us with one piece of advice – when in doubt, recycle; recycling gets sorted, trash does not. E. Cal State Parks:

Have you ever considered working for California State Parks? Well, they're hiring and Scott Bane joined us to explain why it's not only a great institution to work for, but why the work they do is so important. Scott is the Chief Law Enforcement and Emergency Services Officer and has been with Cal Parks for 16 years himself. He explained that he and all rangers are stewards for 280 parks statewide, preserving some of California's most pristine outdoor spaces for the benefit of wildlife and recreation.
