## Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming for each of the above-referenced issues, as detailed below.

- 1. State Basketball Volunteers. The High School 1A Div. 1 State Basketball Tournament is looking for local volunteers from March 6th through the 9th. They need help with everything from door monitors, ticket takers, merchandise sales, and team concierges. An announcement ran two times per day in January and February.
- 2. Puddle Duck Preschool Soup Supper. The annual soup supper to benefit Puddle Duck Preschool is on February 13 from 5:30 to 7 at the Colby Event Center during the Goodland-Colby basketball games. The menu includes chili, chicken noodle, and vegetable beef soups, along with dessert. Donations will be accepted. A 30-second announcement ran two times per day in January.
- 3. GED Preparation. Colby Community College Adult Education offered free tutoring for individuals interested in obtaining their GED. The announcement ran twice per day in January, February, and March.
- 4. ESL Class. Colby Community College Adult Education offered free classes for individuals interested in learning English as a Second Language. The announcement ran two times per day in January, February, and March.
- 5. Blood Drives. KTCC promoted local Red Cross blood drives scheduled in February and March. The PSAs ran three times daily. Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. Donors help patients of all ages: accident and burn victims, heart surgery and

organ transplant patients, and those battling cancer. Anybody in good health who's at least 16 years old and weighs 110 pounds can save a life by donating.

- 6. CCC Bull Sale. The Colby Community College Beef Program had its annual bull sale fundraiser at the college farm on March 22. The sale features six breeds of yearlings from 11 consignors, as well as home-raised heifers. Student announcements aired about four times per day in February and March.
- CCC Endowment Foundation Comedy Night. The Colby Community College Endowment Foundation hosts a comedy Show and Benefit Auction on Saturday, April 13, at Frahm Farmland Headquarters. The event celebrates the college's 60th anniversary this year and features comedian, teacher, and author Chris Voth. Auction proceeds fund endowed scholarships for CCC students. An announcement ran twice daily in January, February, and March.
- 8. Dental Services for Low-Income Patients. The Colby Community College dental hygiene program offers free services to people of all ages in northwest Kansas. The program provides a complete exam from a dentist that includes x-rays, a periodontal evaluation, oral cancer screening, and thorough cleaning. Information can be sent to local dental offices. A 45-second announcement ran two times daily throughout the quarter.
