





And over the past two years, many borrowers have paused on paying these loans because the government paused on payment deadlines due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Last month, Biden's administration vowed to cancel \$10,000 of student loan debt for the average borrower and up to \$20,000 for Pell Grant recipients. We highlight what this move achieves (and doesn't) and what solutions are needed to solve this problem long-term.


