Public Service Announcements (PSA's) generally vary in length from ten seconds to thirty seconds each and, unless otherwise indicated, appear throughout KPRC-TV's broadcast schedule including primetime.

Red Cross Phone Bank - Before the first day of devastating flooding was over, KPRC contacted the Houston Chapter of the Red Cross and in less than 24 hours, we had a full phone bank setup with volunteers to collect money to help the Red Cross' relief effort. Houstonians were clearly looking for a way to help their neighbors because the donations poured in. We raised \$260,000 in the first day, so we decided to host a second day. Our two-day total for money pledged to the Houston Red Cross surpassed \$670,000, making it our most successful disaster relief phone bank.

Senior Scholarships - We presented more senior scholarships to deserving high school students. All of our winners received a \$2,500 scholarship from KPRC and a \$500 gift certificate from Mattress One.

March of Dimes March for Babies - More than 30,000 people attended the March of Dimes walk that was emceed by our own Khambrel Marshall and Britta Merwin.

Making Strides Against Breast Cancer – The event is a fundraiser to help in the fight against breast cancer. Meteorologist Britta Merwin emceed the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk on May 7.

Texas Black Expo - The event features dozens of leaders, stars and musicians in the African American community. Meteorologist Khambrel Marshall emceed the annual corporate luncheon recognizing Texans who make a positive impact in the community.

Red Nose Day - We partnered with NBC and "The Today Show" to make Red Nose Day a success in the Houston market. The fundraiser aims to help lift kids out of poverty, around the world.

Summer Blood Drive - June 16th – 20th. The Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center credits us with this drive being one of their most important and successful blood drives every year.

Clear the Shelters - We're partnering with Telemundo Houston and dozens of local animal shelters on June 23rd to try to get every animal adopted.

Constable ambushed, shot and nearly killed

Deputy Alden Clopton was shot multiple times while his back was turned after a traffic stop on Wednesday, April 13. Clopton is a 48-year-old father of six, whose family has extensive history of serving in Houston law enforcement. The shooting happened near Texas Southern University, after another officer, Deputy Ann Glasgow, pulled a driver over for running a stop sign. After they finished with the traffic stop, Glasgow told Clopton that she was having trouble with the audio in her dashboard camera, and asked him for help. That's when a suspect out of nowhere comes up and opens fire, not related to that traffic stop. This is the second ambush-style attack on a Houston law enforcement officer in eight months.

A historic storm causing widespread flooding and nine deaths. An upper-level low in the United States stalled, resulting in record-breaking rain in and around the Houston metro area, causing severe flooding. There were more than 17 inches of rain in one day in parts of the city, and up to 4 inches of rain per hour that morning at George Bush Intercontinental Airport. This particular storm was the most widespread flood event in Houston since Tropical Storm Allison in 2001, which caused a state of emergency in nine counties. Phil Archer was the first local reporter to get on board a rescue craft, as emergency crews worked to save people who were trapped by flood water. In addition, we provided extensive coverage of rescues from Sky 2; plus special coverage as several new waves of heavy rain hit the Houston metro area on Wednesday, April 20 and Thursday, April 21. Also, as part of our coverage, Channel 2 hosted the Red Cross this week, as they raised money to help the people who lost everything in the floods. Channel 2 viewers and sponsors donated more than \$600,000 to relief efforts.

A young female tiger, named Nahla, was spotted roaming around a Conroe neighborhood. The tiger was captured and animal control officials urged her owner to come forward. Channel 2 crews covered the story for several days, as this already unusual story took several wild twists. The owner came forward a short time later, but the City of Conroe battled the owner and won custody of the animal. We carried portions of the custody hearing live during our 4pm newscast, on Tuesday, April 26. Then, a day later, there was an apparent attempt to steal Nahla from where she was held. Police said a masked man with chain cutters in hand broke into the shelter with the intent of taking Nahla at about 5:40am, just hours before the big cat's scheduled move to a sanctuary in Fort Worth. The man, wearing a camouflage jacket, black shirt and pants and gloves, left after being unable to gain entry into the area holding the tiger, surveillance video showed.

The issue grew when transgender supporters and opponents had dueling rallies outside a Target store in The Heights. Target came under fire by critics and received praise by supporters, after the company decided to allow customers to use the bathroom that they identify with. The story heated up later in the month when President Obama issued an initiative calling for transgender students to use the bathrooms they identify within schools. This sparked Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick to fight back, calling for Texas schools to disobey the President and by the end of the month Texas was part of a lawsuit fighting against the President's directive. It was also a primary topic at Texas' GOP State Convention. In addition, the superintendent of Barbers Hill ISD said he would not abide by the President's directive.

But there are critics of the fee, who say not enough is being done to prevent chronic flooding and they're planning a court battle.

A fire at an auto repair business spread to a warehouse containing dangerous chemicals. The fire led to public safety concerns for people living and working in the Spring Branch area. Channel 2 News provided wall-to-wall coverage of the fire. Reporter Ryan Korsgard spoke with homeowners that were spraying down their homes with water, as the fire was burning, to try to protect their property. Aside from the fire itself, there was concern over a stream tainted from warehouse chemicals, which ran into the water. The water in the stream was "Crayola red" in color; schools of dead fish were washing up on the side of the stream; and people living and working around the area complained of raspy throats and irritated eyes, due to the fire and chemical issues. Channel 2 spoke with the owners of the warehouse, who tell us the chemicals inside the building were approved and up to code.

But the Graves family wants to have its own testing done before handing the bottle over to Dr. Pepper's people.

An unknown assailant stabbed 11 year old Josue Flores to death while walking home from his middle school in North Houston. The Houston Police found a knife on May 25, in a storm drain a few blocks away from where Josue Flores was stabbed to death. Calhoun had an alibi, surveillance video captured him in a local convenience store. We covered the news conference, where police admitted to their mistaken arrest, live during our Midday newscast. Flores' sister was very gracious in speaking with us nearly every time we asked, including immediately after we heard murder charges were dropped against former suspect Che Calhoun.

Severe weather struck on May 26, starting in Bryan/College Station, and moving south into Waller, Washington, and Montgomery Counties. Our Channel 2 News team was live in Bryan with reporter Robert Arnold, who tackled the flooding while finding damaged homes. Prior to our newscasts, Robert shared his ride to Bryan/College Station on social media. That evening, all of our crews covered weather from Jennifer Bauer, who was near Brenham, Cathy Hernandez and Keith Garvin in Montgomery County, and Jace Larson at the Office of Emergency Management headquarters. Overnight on May 27, another round of storms moved through the region. We began our extended coverage at 4am. Brenham endured 19 inches of rain during this storm. Another round of severe storms moved in that Friday afternoon, which led our weather team to provide extended cut-ins throughout the afternoon. In addition, we aired a special, hour-long edition of Channel 2 News at 6pm, as the severe storms were moving through Downtown Houston. During our 6pm broadcast, Brandon Walker obtained exclusive video of a water rescue in Conroe. And, investigative reporter Jace Larson did a special investigative piece on Houston's recent flood problems. A Rice University professor called for local government leaders to buy out homeowners living near bayous, to help provide more greenspace, and areas for water to run off. In addition to all of our run and gun

coverage, we also provided our viewers with an investigative, enterprise story on the floods, to provide perspective, in light of our city's flood problems the past six weeks.

On May 29, an armed gunman, traveled from California to Houston, and opened fire on Memorial Drive, during Memorial Day weekend. In all, an innocent man was killed, before seven others were wounded during an hour-long rampage that ended when officers killed the gunman. Reporters Sara Donchey and Jake Reiner were first on the scene, to provide viewers with instant updates on the public safety threat, and to alert the public when the threat was over. On Memorial Day, May 30, our team spoke to the father of the gunman. Investigative reporter Joel Eisenbaum spoke by phone with the father of Dionisio Garza from California. Soon afterwards, we sent Sara Donchey to the Rancho Cucamonga area to try to track down family members. Overnight on May 31, we spoke with Garza's mother and father, (sound with the parents, they did not want to show their faces on camera) providing insight into their son's mental health problems, after serving in the military and returning from Afghanistan.

Channel 2 crews were focused on two areas primarily; Fort Bend and Brazoria Counties, where thousands of homes were flooded due from the Brazos River. Texas Governor Greg Abbott toured the worst of the damage. Reporter Ryan Korsgard was in Brazoria County, to join Governor Abbott when he saw the extent of the damage. In addition, we spent multiple days covering the heartbreaking stories of long-time homeowners, who lived in these neighborhoods for decades, losing nearly everything they owned due to the horrific flooding. One of the more unique flooding stories occurred when reporter Phil Archer saved a dog in Fort Bend county, that was chained outside of its' home. He and rescue crews pulled the dog to safety. Animal control officials later renamed the dog "Archer" in honor of Phil. Days later, the Fort Bend County Sheriff adopted "Archer." Soon afterwards, Phil tracked down "Archer's" former owner, who suffered from health problems, and tried to get back to the dog, but his street was blocked off due to the flooding. He gave up the animal, after he was rescued. Finally, on Monday, June 20, PETA honored Phil and the county sheriff for their efforts to save and adopt "Archer."
