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### **Face the Issues**

Issues: Public Health, Community Development

### **Street Medicine Teams: Healthcare for the Homeless** - 30 minutes

Bennie Eliason, the Street Medicine site manager with Valley Health Partners, talks with Sam Chen about providing holistic primary health care to people experiencing homelessness. They talk about the challenges and differences between traditional healthcare and providing care for patients on the streets. Bennie elaborates on some of the larger challenges such as weather conditions, the ability for follow up visits, and occasionally a distrust of authority from patients they overcome to assist in patient medical needs. They also talk about the aspects of the Street Team beyond immediate physical care such as assistance in applying for medical insurance or benefits and food assistance programs. With such assistance Bennie explains from 5 years ago there may have been about 25% of their patients who had state health insurance whereas today its closer to 85%.

### **Gift of Life Donor Program** - 30 minutes

This week Sam Chen interviews Dwendy Johnson, Community Relations Supervisor - Gift of Life Donor Program & Frank Garger, Organ Donation Recipient and Ambassador, Gift of Life Donor Program. They talk about the importance of organ donation, dispel misconceptions around it, and talk about the experience Frank had as a recipient.

Gift of Life Organ Donation Program is our region's organ procurement agency, which collaborates with hospitals and works with families who's loved one had yes to organ donation can give that gift of life through organ and tissue donation. They work with donations for eight solid organ donations, and tissue donations like skin, bone and corneas, making it possible for one donor to save or enhance the lives of seventy five to one hundred people.

### [The Road to Addiction Recovery & Back](#) - 30 minutes

In part one of this episode, Sam Chen interviews Jason Beckwith, Founder & President: JSB Works LLC & Action in Recovery. They talk about Jason's personal story through recovery and going back to help others along their recovery journey. Discussions include how addiction affects people and those around them, sober living homes, and hearing from people currently being helped by Jason.

Jason explains that if more was invested in aftercare to help bolster successful recoveries following in-patient treatment, it would save tax payer's money, increase likelihood of success, and decrease crime in communities.

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### [Fentanyl Awareness and Family Recovery](#) - 30 minutes

In some cases the medicine prescribed to ease pain is the same medicine that often creates pain. We're talking, of course, of fentanyl and the opioid crisis that has run rampant throughout our country, our state and our local communities. So what can we do to confront it? How can we help families who are on this journey through it? Rhonda miller is the executive director of Speak Up for Ben, and she joins Samuel Chen to talk about those questions and more. Discussions include how this problem rose to such a prominent level, and the differences between people's experience with pharmaceutical fentanyl and illicitly manufactured fentanyl; the latter of which contributes the vast majority of these overdoses. They also dive into how a family of someone addicted to opioids and fentanyl can spot the signs, some methods to help in their recovery as well as ways to care for themselves during that process, and in cases where their loved one has passed away, how to find resources in their community to support them through their grief.

### [Local Agriculture](#) - 30 minutes

Local food sales account for about 1.5% of the US's produce, yet 84% of the world's farms are considered "small farms". This week Sam Chen interviews Madeline Squarcia, the Coordinator of Local Foods and Environment Initiatives at Buy Fresh, Buy Local Greater Lehigh Valley to talk about why that is, and how we can purchase more of our food from local farmers and the benefits that has for the local economy and our health.

### [Medicaid Re-Enrollment](#) - 30 minutes

The end of the COVID 19 pandemic may mean regulation changes for many of the things we've grown accustomed to, including health care, that's the issue facing Medicaid right now with millions of individuals may having to reenroll. So what caused this and what can you do about it, especially if you're among the affected? Katie Meier, the government editor and reporter for Spotlight PA, joins Samuel Chen to talk about those issues and more.

There are certain rules and regulations that are sunseting and others are coming back into play, and this affects a lot of different things that affect all of us, including health care. And one of those issues involves Medicaid and may involve changes for millions of people on Medicaid.

The big change is that people now have to reenroll annually. Traditionally, under the program, you had to do an annual re enrollment so the federal government and the state would reassess whether you qualify for Medicaid every year, but during the pandemic, beginning in 2020, those annual re enrollments stopped, allowing you to stay in the program if you were in it in 2020. For the first time in three years, you can actually lose your coverage if you do not qualify or fill out your paperwork correctly.

Discussions include what to expect in this process, how to find resources to assist in filling out the required paperwork from legal groups and other advocacy organizations, the submission process and the technical challenges the government faces as the policy shifts back.

### [Mental Health Today](#) - 30 min.

Health isn't compartmentalized and mental health can affect much more than just the mind.

That's the approach the community Council Health Systems takes, offering a holistic approach to mental health. Joe Watkins, the president and CEO of the CCHS and the host of Joe Watkins State of Independence on Lighthouse TV, joins Sam Chen to talk about mental health.

CCHS assists people of all ages that may be experiencing cognitive challenges, psychology or physical challenges and people that experience psychological challenges spurred on by trauma.

Discussion includes what may have led to the uptick in mental and behavioral health problems in the country from more fractured families to a society that is always online but less connected to a community and the impact isolation over the pandemic has had on the people that CCHS helps. In cases like people experiencing homelessness or substance abuse, Joe explains the need to help the whole person to get to root issues a person has.

### [Fostering Homes with Kindness](#) - 30 minutes

This week on Face the Issue, Sam Chen speaks with Jenae Holtzhafer, the founder and exec. dir. of The Kindness Project, and Takyra Batz, a board member of The Kindness Project.



Discussions include foster care, the challenges the children and families face in foster care as well as what The Kindness Project is doing to aid them by providing free, essential items to those families.

Children in foster care can often struggle with feelings of not belonging, being pulled out of what they know and enter a new world of new people. One of the main goals for The Kindness Project is to make a child feel safe and build a relationship with them when they come in. There are approximately 14,000 PA children currently in foster care. Just from the vantage point of The Kindness Project, they have seen the number of children served locally double, they say points to an increase in the amount of children in foster care in need for support.

This interview points foster families to a local resource in aiding them obtain clothes, shoes, school supplies, hygiene items and more, as well as a place where viewers can volunteer to help these families.

### [Military Experience](#) - 30 minutes

Honoring our military men and women is something we often do in the United States, but so often we take their sacrifices for granted. So what is it like to be in the military today? And what are ways that those of us who don't serve can honor those who do? Gunnery Sergeant Cameron McNeill, United States Marine Corps and Sergeant Gregg Moreland, retired from the United States Army, join Sam Chen to talk about their experiences and what the military is like today.

Gunnery Sergeant Cameron McNeill explains what someone can expect when joining the Marines, from mental and physical qualifications to bootcamp and becoming a team with your fellow recruits. He also talks about the opportunities and jobs people in the military have beyond what the public may expect, from engineers to working on humanitarian missions.

Retired Sergeant Gregg Moreland recounts his experience in the Army and the explosion that knocked him unconscious leaving him with head and neck injuries. He details his return home and the importance for veterans to reach out for help and find a support network and gives some resources. He also encourages people outside the military to support organizations like the Wounded Warrior Project and others.

### [Financial Literacy](#) - 30 minutes

How do we learn financial literacy? What impact will it have and what are some programs available to the community? Gabriel Rendon is the founder and executive director of the Financial Literacy Center of The Lehigh Valley. He joins Sam Chen to break down those questions and more on this episode of Face the Issues.

Rendon explains that financial literacy is basically understanding your relationship to money, learning and understanding what it takes for you to go from where you're at today to where you want to be and understanding the steps that you need to take to reach your goals. Only a third of Americans have a budget, and for those who don't they may be open to a lot of financial pitfalls. Rendon explains that just because someone has low income doesn't mean they are bad with finances and inversely just because someone might be wealthy it doesn't mean they are making good decisions with their finances, so everyone can benefit from learning financial literacy skills, like understanding interest, credit and how to budget.
