The programs and services include prevention, intervention, and therapy for individuals and families to enhance their quality of life, emergency assistance including food distribution, emergency financial aid, adoption services and help for the homeless. Most of the revenue for the Agency comes from the Southern Nevada region.

The Agency also aids Holocaust survivors and other seniors which includes assistance with basic living necessities, counseling and case management to provide emotional support, ensuring access to food, supplying medical and prescription assistance, and offering social opportunities.

They attend illness-specific sessions of varying lengths where they have the opportunity to solidify and renew their relationships while meeting others facing similar challenges. Bereavement programming is also provided for families who have lost a child to the illnesses served at Camp.
