Below is a summary illustrating how WMGC-HD1 addressed key community issues throughout the three month period ending June 30, 2014.

#### 1. Economy

Melvin Goodman, author, *National Insecurity: The Cost of American Militarism*, discussed how ceding foreign policy decisions to the Pentagon has led to wars rather than diplomacy, and that the military/industrial complex has distorted the economy. 25 min.

George Caffentzis, co-editor of The Debt Resisters' Operations Manual, said much of the staggering debt Americans suffer is illegitimate and offered strategies, both individually and politically to address the issue. 25 min.
