TOPIC: LAW ENFORCEMENT LENGTH: 20 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney Burnetta Bandy. They discussed the legal issues surrounding the case of Larry Morrison, the 34-year-old Eastside Detroit man arrested by Detroit Police for trying to break into his own car. Mildred explained the viral video shows Detroit police officers attempting to arrest Morrison, who locked his keys in his car. She also explained the video shows the officers tackling and pulling a gun on the man as he tried to break into his own car. Bandy highlighted the officers are currently on administrative duty and are under investigation. Several listeners called in to weigh their opinions on the controversial story.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed pop culture columnist, Cornell Jermaine and fashion designer, Keisha Sims. They discussed a wide array of popular news headlining stories. Reeves explained the plan is designed to reward homeowners and penalize neglectful landowners. Mildred shared that under the proposed plan, 97% of Detroit homeowners would get an average 17% permanent property tax cut starting in the year 2025. Listeners called in to weigh their opinions on the topic.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Robert Shumake, known also as Shaman Shu of Soul Tribes International Ministries. They discussed the recent report of the Detroit Police raiding his church. Shu explained he believed the city and police were targeting him because he offered mushrooms – which he called sacred plants – to his members.

Mayor Mike Duggan. Johnson explained the proposed plan would reduce taxes on buildings by 30% and triple taxes on land. Waters highlighted the plan looks good on paper but would hurt residents in the long run. Listeners called in with questions for the council members.

TOPIC: CURRENT EVENTS LENGTH: 20 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Shaman Shu of Soul Tribes International Ministries. They discussed an update on his case against the Detroit police for their raid of his church. Shu believed the city targeted him because he was offering psychedelic mushrooms to his congregation. Shu explained that he plans to sue the city and the police department for what he called an illegal raid on his property. Listeners called in to weigh their opinions on the topic.

Mogk explained the benefits of the plan for Detroit residents. Mildred commended Mogk for his work in economic development. Listeners called in to weigh in on the topic.

TOPIC: DETROIT POLITICS LENGTH: 15 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Russ Bellant, journalist and organizer with Detroiters for Tax Justice. They discussed the organization's critique of the proposed Detroit Land Value Tax plan. Bellant explained the plan as described by the city and explained by Mayor Duggan violates two elements of the Michigan constitution.

Mildred Gaddis held an open-line segment for listeners to discuss the topics of the day's show and current news headlines. Mildred shared a news report of Carlee Russell, the Alabama nursing student who made national headlines when she made a false 911 report and went missing. Mildred explained the young lady was ordered to pay \$18,000 in restitution and face a year in jail. Listeners called in with their opinions on the topics.

Carter explained the emails were reportedly sent while Hall was in college. He also highlighted the emails were filled with racially charged threats towards a student at his girlfriend's college. Mildred and Carter both condemned the emails. Listeners called in to weigh their opinions on the topic.

TOPIC: LAW ENFORCEMENT LENGTH: 15 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis shared a recent report of Detroit Police Commissioner Ricardo Moore accusing Detroit Police Chief James White of deceiving the public. She explained an officer was accused of punching an elderly man outside a bar in Midtown Detroit. She also shared the elderly man has since died and Moore had accused Chief White of changing the narrative surrounding the incident after the victim was in grave condition. Listeners called in to weigh in their opinions on the topic.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Hattiesburg, Mississippi City Councilwoman Deborah Delgado. Delgado explained the US Supreme Court is hearing arguments in the case of Alexander v. South Carolina State Conference of the NAACP. She shared that the case involves a dispute over the congressional map that South Carolina's Republican-controlled legislature enacted after the 2020 census. Listeners called in to discuss their opinions on the topic.

Mildred also highlighted the call for Vassar's resignation stemmed from a seven-page letter from Trustee Brianna Scott, accusing Vassar of bullying board members and violating codes of conduct and ethics. Smith shared that Vassar has called the allegations baseless and untruths and that she would not resign.
