Gina Crash spoke with James Piper Bond, President & CEO, Living Classrooms Foundation. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, Living Classrooms, (founded in Baltimore in 1985 and for the last 20 years also serves Washington, DC), continues to inspire youth, children and adults to achieve their potential through hands-on education, workforce development, health and wellness and violence prevention programming. Living Classrooms still provides services from a distance to meet the needs of their families and to keep students engaged virtually to prevent learning loss. Living Classrooms' Project SERVE works to assist returning citizens as they transition from prison back into their lives. They recently teamed with Royal Farms to supply food and beverage to 325 residents of Perkins Homes, Baltimore's second largest public housing community. Living Classrooms also operates two Safe Streets sites in Baltimore and just kicked off a new effort in partnership with the Michal Phelps Foundation to deliver social-emotional wellness education to Baltimore City students during the summer.
