There is an effort to free up beds to make them available to the population that it's trying to serve. According to data from the Echo's Dashboard, there are more than 4,000 people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in Austin without children. The homeless strategy office estimates that nearly 800 beds are needed by 2025 for that group.

Austin Mayor, Kirk Watson, stated that the city opened its 7 <sup>th</sup> shelter last night and shelters will continue to operate to help people get through the bitter cold. CapMetro is running the bus routes to One Texas Center and providing free transportation to the shelter.
