Issue #3: Gun Safety Measures and Mass Shootings. Colorado recently expereinced another mass shooting. KUNC also continued follow up coverage with the Colorado legislative session, which included proposals for fireare reform The police have identified the suspect of a shooting Wednesday at East High School as 17 year-old Austin Lyle. Denver Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Alex Marrero issued a lette to parents stating that he has directed the Denver Police Department to bring armed officers back into comprehensive public high schools for the rest of the school year.
