Issue: Storm Preparation

Issue: North Carolina's Fight Against Human Trafficking

Synopsis: Shawna Pagano's organization, Pat's Place, works closely with Project NO REST and serves as a one-stop shop for child victims of human trafficking and abuse, providing medical, mental, and legal support. Issue: Teachers Vs. Gender Ideology

Synopsis: Like students, teachers are not required to check their faith at the classroom door, but that has not stopped certain schools from trying to control the actions and even the speech of its teachers and professors. Many of these violations of First Amendment rights come as teachers attempt to push back against the gender ideology that is permeating schools nationwide. Matt Sharp, senior legal counsel and Director of the Center for Legislative Advocacy at ADF, joins Traci DeVette Griggs on this week's episode of Family Policy Matters to discuss these cases and explain just how broadly and deeply gender ideology is invading our nation's schools

Issue: NC SB 688: Expansion of Gambling in North Carolina

This bill passed the State Senate two weeks ago, and awaits action in the State House.

Issue: Parental Rights

Air Date: 9/11/2021

Synopsis: From underaged abortion to life-altering “gender reassignment” surgeries, children—and the rights of parents to lead and protect them—are in danger.

The Parental Rights Foundation has worked for fifteen years to add a parental rights amendment to the U.S. Constitution. More recently, they’ve filed a lawsuit on behalf of several Washington, D.C. parents to fight a new vaccine law the District recently passed. James Mason is president of the Parental Rights Foundation, and he joins host Traci DeVette Griggs on this week’s episode of Family Policy Matters to discuss the case.

Issue: North Carolina’s SB 711–NC Compassionate Care Act

Synopsis: North Carolina’s SB 711–NC Compassionate Care Act, would legalize marijuana for “medical” use. This bill currently resides in the Senate Rules Committee, having already passed the Senate Judiciary, Finance, and Health Care Committees. The potential impacts of this bill are enormous and wide-spread.

To explore this hot-button issue, we welcome Luke Niforatos, executive vice president of Smart Approaches to Marijuana, to this week’s episode of the Family Policy Matters radio show and podcast. Smart Approaches to Marijuana focuses on a “health-first” approach to marijuana policy in an industry where important health and medical information is becoming less and less valued.
