## **Officials seek public's help to locate missing Red Lake man**

Red Lake authorities are looking for a missing Red Lake man who hasn't been seen since late October. Twenty-six year old Dillon James Sayers has not been seen since Oct. 23. He was then reported missing Oct. 30. Authorities are not sure why he may have disappeared. The Minnesota Department of Corrections has listed Sayers as a fugitive since Oct. 31.

Red Lake Director of Public Safety, William Brunelle, says it's an active investigation and they don't know if there's foul play or if he absconded because of warrants. Sayers is wanted by the DOC in connection to charges of failure to register as a predatory offender and third-degree criminal sexual conduct.

Sayers is described as a 5 feet 9 inches tall, 160-pound Native American male with short brown hair. He has Native design tattoos on his right arm.

Sayers was last seen on the Red Lake Indian Reservation. Those with information about his whereabouts should contact the Red Lake Police Department.

## **Two Good Samaritans Save Man After 4-Wheeler Goes Into Open Water**

12-07-18

In what could have resulted in a tragic accident, two good Samaritans jumped in to save a man from drowning after a 4-wheeler he was driving reportedly drove into open water on Wall Lake around 10:30pm late Thursday. Two men witnessed sixty-five year old Leon Engelhart of Fergus Falls in open water and his 4-wheeler submerged. Thirty-seven year old Cameron Hanson and thirty-five year old Jacob Payson sprang into action and pulled Engelhart out of the water and onto shore where Fergus Falls First Responders, Otter Tail County Sheriff's Deputies, and Ringdahl Ambulance provided medical care for severe hypothermia.

Eventually, Engelhart was transported to Lake Region Healthcare. The Sheriff's Office says alcohol \*was\* a factor in the incident. Before being transported Deputies obtained a warrant for a blood draw. No charges have been filed, but the incident is still being investigated by the Otter County Sheriff's Office. Englehart remains in stable condition at the hospital.

Lien also said the CDC says the advisory covers all types or uses of romaine lettuce, such as whole heads of romaine, hearts of romaine, and bags and boxes of pre-cut lettuce and salad mixes that contain romaine, including baby romaine, spring mix, and Caesar salad.

They are also advising that restaurants and retailers should not serve or sell any romaine lettuce, including salads and salad mixes containing romaine.

So far thirty-two people have been infected in 11 states.

National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day is today. National Take-Back Day is a safe, convenient, and responsible way to dispose of unused or expired prescription drugs. The last Take-Back Day brought in almost 1 million pounds of unused or expired prescription medication nationally.

Locally, the Grant and Wilkin County Sheriff's Offices are taking part with the events going from 10am to 2pm Saturday.

In Otter Tail County a year-round program called "Take it to the Box" program allows residents to drop off unwanted and outdated prescription drugs in a secure receptacle at drop off locations in Battle Lake, Fergus Falls, Henning, New York Mills, Ottertail, Parker's Prairie, Pelican Rapids, and Perham.

No syringes, needles or sharps are accepted.

## **Ada Man Rescues Driver Trapped In Burning Vehicle**

10-24-18

Austen Germolus says he's no hero. The 33-year-old Ada man rescued a driver trapped in a burning vehicle following a crash Monday night on a county road near Borup, Minnesota. He says he did what anyone would do in a situation like that.

Germolus says the SUV was hot from the flames and it looked like the fire was getting closer to the driver. The driver was conscious but the vehicle doors were jammed so Germolus broke out a window and pulled the man to safety.

Norman County Sheriff Jeremy Thornton says moments after the rescue, the SUV was engulfed in flames. He says the driver, 40-year-old Zebulen Dickey, of Georgetown would not have survived. Dickey was transported to a Fargo hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Dickey rear-ended a grain truck that had slowed to turn into a farm. The impact sent Dickey's SUV into a ditch where it started on fire. The driver of the grain truck, 60-year-old John Germolus, of Borup had only minor injuries. He texted his son, Austen, who was working in a nearby field, and asked for help immediately after the crash and he arrived to make the rescue.

## **H5N2 Avian Influenza Confirmed In Kandiyohi County Commercial Turkey Flock**

10-24-18

The Minnesota Board of Animal Health has confirmed a case of H5N2 low pathogenic avian influenza in a commercial turkey flock in Kandiyohi County. The disease was detected during routine surveillance testing of the flock of 10,000 13-week-old turkey toms on October 19. The farm includes an additional three barns housing 10,000 birds each, all of which have tested negative. This is not the same virus that was the cause of the highly pathogenic avian influenza outbreak in the Midwest in 2015.

This strain does not pose a risk to the public, and there is no food safety concern for consumers. The Board of Animal Health is working with all federal, state and industry partners to prevent the spread of the disease. Poultry producers are asked to maintain strong biosecurity practices at their facilities to isolate their flocks from outside sources of infection.

## **Dog attacks walker in Pelican Rapids**

A man out for a late morning walk in Pelican Rapids on Tuesday was bitten by a dog. The victim said he was walking down a road when the dog ran out to the road and bit him on his left hand. The walker received a small single puncture wound to his left hand. The dog is up to date on his immunizations and has no previous bites on record. Photos were taken and report was made to public health.

## **Two Fergus Falls Businesses Fail Tobacco Compliance Checks**

10-10-18

Fifteen Fergus Falls Businesses were part of a random tobacco compliance check conducted on Tuesday by the Fergus Falls Police and resulted in two individual cashiers being issued citations who work for two area businesses.

Of the fifteen businesses involved, the two businesses that failed the checks were Little Chief in the 1600 block of Pebble Lake Road and Lakeway Market in the 1800 block of East Fir Ave. One of the cashiers cited was a minor himself, who was 16 yrs old and the other was 52 yr Denise French, both of Fergus Falls.

Fergus Falls city ordinance states that any business found to have violated the tobacco ordinance, or whose employee has violated the ordinance, shall be charged an administrative fine of \$100, with \$200 for a second offense at the same licensed premises within a 24-month period.

## **Minnesota Dept of Health Advising Doctors to Look out for Rare Illness**

10-08-18

State health officials are asking doctors to be on the lookout for children with a rare, polio-like illness after six cases were reported in Minnesota since September 20th. Symptoms of Acute flaccid myelitis (my-lite-UHS) include sudden weakness in an arm or leg and loss of muscular reflexes. The Department of Health's Kris Ehresman (AIRS-men) says at this point they aren't sure of the extent of the outbreak...

OUTCUE: "...information is aggregated.

Ehresman advises parents to seek medical attention if they notice "any kind of acute muscle weakness in their kids, in arms and legs, that obviously doesn't have anything to do with spraining your ankle at soccer." Ehresman says its unknown what causes A-F-M but people should observe good hygiene and be sure vaccinations are up-to-date. A-F-M is serious but rare, affecting about one-in-a-million people.

## **Fergus Falls City Leaders Discuss Changing Workforce**

## >>Premiums Decreasing for Minnesota Individual Health Insurance Market

(St. Paul, MN) -- Premiums on Minnesota's individual health insurance market are expected to drop again next year by seven-point-four to nearly 28 percent. The state Commerce Department released the 2019 numbers prior to the November 1st enrollment period. Health Commissioner Jan Malcolm says no network service areas will be reduced and most counties will have two or three available provider networks and associated qualified health plans. A person's actual premium depends on their individual situation and health plan selected. Those receiving tax credits generally will not see as much of a decrease as those who pay the full cost of their own premium. Rates in the small group market will drop by two-point-four to nearly 12 percent.

## **Fergus Falls YMCA Director Resigns**

In a memo to staff and members of the Fergus Falls YMCA, Executive Director Dennis Lipp has called it quits. Lipp announced Tuesday that he is returning to his previous position at the YMCA in Manitowish Waters, Wisconsin. His last day is scheduled for November 16<sup>th</sup>.

In the coming days the Fergus Falls YMCA Board of Directors will work with Y-USA to find his ultimate replacement. Lipp started in the position in Fergus Falls a little over four years ago.

## **National Presidential Emergency Alert Test Today**

10-03-18

Fergus Falls Police are reminding residents that they will receive a presidential emergency alert test, and to not be alarmed. FEMA in coordination with the FCC will conduct a nationwide test of the Wireless Emergency Alerts and Emergency Alert System at 1:18 this afternoon, and the Emergency Alert System portion follows at 1:20. The test will assess the operational readiness of the infrastructure for distribution of a national message and determine whether improvements are needed. Otter Tail County Emergency Manager Patrick Waletzko...

OUTCUE: "...different than a regular text."

This is the fourth Emergency Alert System nationwide test and the first national Wireless Emergency Alert. Previous national tests were conducted in 2011, 2016, and 2017 in collaboration with the FCC, broadcasters, and emergency management officials in Otter Tail County in recognition of FEMA's National Preparedness Month.



## **Mahnomen Apartment Building Fire**

10-01-18

Fire gutted an apartment and displaced other renters at a Mahnomen apartment building early Sunday morning.

A Mahnomen County deputy was driving by the apartment building when she noticed smoke coming out of the bottom floor apartment. The occupant of the apartment told the deputy that he was cooking something on the stove and it got away from him. Fire departments from Mahnomen, Waubun, and Twin Lakes responded.

All of the tenants were able to get out safely. They were placed at the Shooting Star Casino and with relatives. The Red Cross is helping with getting some personal items.

The apartment where the fire started will have to be replaced. The rest of the building had smoke damage. Tenants will be able to return at a later date after cleanup is completed.

The cause of the fire is under investigation by the State Fire Marshall.

## **Psychiatrist Says More Studies Needed For Medical Marijuana**

The push nationwide has been towards legalizing marijuana. Nine states and the District of Columbia have legalized marijuana for recreational use.
