WBZ's Nichole Davis spoke with Lyndia Downie, Executive Director of Pine Street Inn, about the Boston Planning and Development Agency's recent approval of a plan for the Comfort Inn on Morrissey Boulevard in Dorchester, MA, to be transformed into permanent supportive housing for seniors. The project got some blowback from neighborhood groups and lawmakers, but Pine Street Inn says it's a critical step to help unhoused seniors make their way off the streets and rebuild their lives. They discussed the project, the fight over the Long Island Bridge, and their upcoming workforce development graduation.

Decades ago, the business closed down, but thanks to the City Councilor it's getting new life.

Now, it's found its way into the illicit drug market and combined with fentanyl and other opioids, it's proving to be especially deadly. Burns talked about their efforts to fund new research for test strips, another method of harm reduction that could potentially help to turn this crisis around.
