#### NAN Responds to McCarthy's Ouster

For the first time in history, the Speaker of the House was voted out this week. As Kevin McCarthy was forced out following internal Republican fighting and a push by far-right conservatives, **National Action Network** highlighted the danger of the House being in such disarray.

**NAN's** Washington, D.C. office is working closely with the Congressional Black Caucus on how to handle whoever is picked as the next Speaker and where things go from here. **Rev. Sharpton** emphasized the fact that Republican chaos cannot and should not disrupt governance, and that the needs of the American people must be front and center.

## Trump's Civil Trial

**National Action Network** has been closely monitoring Donald Trump's recent civil trial and all of the developments surrounding it. This week, **Rev. Sharpton** discussed the implications at length on both *Morning Joe* and *The Beat with Ari Melber* on MSNBC. He pointed out the fact that Trump has constructed this whole myth that he's somehow a great businessman and now feels the need to try and defend it.

"Part of the reason he showed up is because he doesn't think anyone can fight and defend him like he can," said **Rev. Sharpton** on *Morning Joe*.

**Rev. Sharpton** stated that he's known and fought with Trump for 30 years, and that the proverbial leader of the Republican Party is a supreme narcissist who had to be present in that courtroom. Both Trump and Rudy Giuliani (who owes more than a half-million dollars in unpaid taxes according to a court filing), have been political adversaries of **NAN** and **Rev. Sharpton** for years. The former Trump attorney and the former President himself find themselves in a real quagmire.

## NAN Vows to Continue Fighting Ed Blum

After standing in solidarity with the Fearless Fund, a Black-owned organization which financially supports Black and Brown female entrepreneurs, **NAN** vowed to continue fighting for them and others who are targets of conservative activist Edward Blum. He and his Texas-based group sued the Fearless Fund in an effort to disrupt their work and stifle any notion of progress. He has been behind the movement to end affirmative action, as well as gutting the Voting Rights Act in 2013.

**Rev. Sharpton** and **NAN** renewed their commitment to fight back against Blum and the conservative activists seeking to dismantle affirmative action, diversity, equity and inclusion. When racial disparities still exist across the board, folks like Blum are trying to halt even a tiny semblance of movement in the right direction.

The Fearless Fund are among this year's honorees at the **Triumph Awards**, which will take place <u>on</u> <u>Monday October 16th</u> at Jazz at Lincoln Center in New York City. Other recipients include Tony Awardwinning actor Leslie Odom Jr., cast and producers of Ossie Davis' Broadway revival play Purlie Victorious, the Anti-Defamation League's Jonathan Greenblatt, U.S. Track & Field's Max Siegel and Martha's Vineyard Film Festival's Stephanie and Floyd Rance.

## Alabama's Congressional Maps

**Rev. Sharpton** this week applauded a federal court's selection of new Congressional maps in Alabama, which creates a second majority Black district in the state. The three-judge panel's decision is the result of the Supreme Court's surprise ruling in June that the Alabama legislature drew district lines in violation of the Voting Rights Act.

"This is a good day – one we have been fighting for since John Lewis and hundreds of marchers were beaten on the Edmund Pettus Bridge," said **Rev. Sharpton**. "But let's not forget that states are in this mess because the Supreme Court gutted the Voting Rights Act a decade ago. We must use this moment to galvanize the push for Congress to finally pass the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act. The march must go on."

National Action Network immediately condemned the terrorist attacks in Israel last weekend, and reaffirmed its commitment to stand in solidarity with organizations like the Anti-Defamation
League. Rev. Sharpton, along with a coalition of civil rights leaders including Martin Luther King
III, Arndrea Waters King, Marc Morial of the National Urban League, Derrick Johnson of the NAACP and others, released a statement of support.

**NAN** also urges Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu not to weaponize water, food and electricity. While explicitly against Hamas' actions, **NAN** also believes that basic human needs must be protected, civilian casualties avoided and a peaceful two-state solution with recognized boundaries must be achieved.

## NAN Urges the Supreme Court To Uphold Voting Rights

**National Action Network** calls on the Supreme Court to uphold a lower court's ruling regarding a South Carolina voting map as unconstitutionally racially gerrymandered. The Supreme Court this week heard oral arguments in the case which could have implications for other cases, as well as 2024 elections.

In January, a three-judge panel in the Federal District Court in Columbia, S.C. ruled that the state's First Congressional District violated the Constitution by making race the predominant factor. **Rev. Sharpton** and **NAN** urge the Supreme Court to uphold this ruling, thereby remaining consistent with their own ruling on a similar case from Alabama in which they determined that state lawmakers there had diluted the power of Black voters.

An unconstitutionally racially gerrymandered voting map cannot and must not be accepted under any circumstances. The voices of Black voters and their voting power must be preserved.

## Keeping the Heat on Ed Blum

**National Action Network** is gearing up to take on Edward Blum, the conservative activist who has targeted affirmative action and voting rights both in the courts and in society. He was the person behind the case that the Supreme Court used to gut the Voting Rights Act in 2013, and he was behind the case that the Court used to overturn affirmative action earlier this year.

Following the Supreme Court's devastating decision regarding affirmative action in higher education, **Rev. Sharpton** warned that the ramifications would be far and wide including in the corporate sector. That is precisely what Blum and other right-wing strategists are methodically doing now. One of their first targets was the **Fearless Fund**, an organization founded by Black women which financially empowers other Black female entrepreneurs.

**National Action Network** rallied with the Fearless Fund in Atlanta a few weeks back, and joined the founders as they went to court in a show of solidarity. The Fearless Fund co-founders, Arian Simone and Ayana Parsons, will be honored Monday at **NAN's Triumph Awards at Jazz at Lincoln Center**. Other honorees include Tony award-winning actor Leslie Odom Jr., the cast and producers of Ossie Davis'

Broadway revival play Purlie Victorious, the Anti-Defamation League's Jonathan Greenblatt, U.S. Track & Field's Max Siegel and the Martha's Vineyard Film Festival's Stephanie and Floyd Rance.

# Florida is Ground Zero

On Sunday, **Rev. Sharpton** was in Tallahassee, Florida preaching first at Bethel Missionary Baptist Church alongside **National Action Network** Board Member and head of **NAN's** Tallahassee chapter, Rev. Dr. R.B. Holmes Jr. He then led a press conference and rally with students from **FAMU** (Florida A&M University), a historically Black college.

He denounced DeSantis' ongoing efforts to erase Black history and create some sort of revisionist history by implementing a curriculum that states Black people somehow benefitted from slavery. **Rev. Sharpton** highlighted the Governor's clear political pandering, and the dangers of rewriting history.

#### **Support for Civilian Lives Everywhere**

Over the course of the last few weeks, **Rev. Sharpton** has made many appearances on "**Morning Joe**", as well as hosted his own program, "**Politics Nation**", both on **MSNBC**, where he firmly condemned the attack against Israeli civilians on October 7th and supported those who stand against hate. He and **National Action Network** are also equally concerned about civilians in Gaza and the high death toll and devastation reported on the ground.

**Rev. Sharpton** reminded everyone that we cannot have sliding moralities, we cannot value one peoples' lives over another. He called for more humanitarian aid, and once again pushed for peace. This weekend on "**Politics Nation**" he will have representatives of both the Jewish community, as well as the Arab/Muslim community on the broadcast.

## **Continued Fight for Tyre Nichols**

**Rev. Sharpton** and **National Action Network** welcomed the news this week that former Memphis police officer Desmond Mills Jr. pleaded guilty in the fatal beating of **Tyre Nichols**. He admitted to one count of deprivation of rights under color of law after using excessive force and failing to intervene, and one count of witness tampering. He is the first of five officers charged in the case to admit guilt.

Following Tyre's brutal death, **Rev. Sharpton** delivered a moving eulogy in Memphis, where **Vice President Kamala Harris** also spoke and urged Congress to pass the **George Floyd Justice in Policing Act**. NAN renews calls for its passage once again so that true reform can take place.

## Justice for Dexter Wade

**Rev. Sharpton** and **National Action Network** call on the Department of Justice to investigate the Jackson, Mississippi police department over the murder and apparent coverup of **Dexter Wade**. His family spent months searching for him, only to find out that he had been fatally struck by a Jackson Police Department car and buried in a pauper's grave without their knowledge and despite the fact that the family had filed a missing person's report in mid-March.

Sharpton** went to the **White House** this week for a meeting with **Neera Tanden**, Domestic Policy Advisor to **President Biden**, and a subsequent one with White House **Chief of Staff Jeff Zients**. The focus of the discussions was on funding of public hospitals, and the impact of certain policies on low-income Americans, as well as the safety net itself.

**Rev. Sharpton** expressed his concern about actions that reversed President Obama's directed payment program, thereby reducing Medicaid spending in low-income areas and communities of color. These proposals erode the value of policy initiatives started by the Obama Administration and instead implement a highly criticized Trump proposal. He discussed these issues and more with **Neera Tanden**, who seemed sympathetic to **National Action Network's** concerns, and had a similar conversation with **Jeff Zients**.

# Tracy K. Smith

On Monday, **Rev. Sharpton** went on *Morning Joe* on **MSNBC** where he joined the panel as they interviewed Pulitzer-prize winner **Tracy K. Smith**, poet and educator who served as the **22nd Poet Laureate** of the United States from 2017-2019. She has a new memoir, "**To Free the Captives: A Plea for the American Soul**" which she discussed on the broadcast.

**Tracy K. Smith** talked at length about free vs. freed, how those who were freed look at the world differently, Black civil war soldiers, racism in America, connecting your life to a bigger picture and so much more. She ended the conversation on a note of hope, that we can learn from the painful lessons of the past and present in order to sustain a brighter future.

## Conclusion of 21-Days of Prayer for Peace

National Action Network concluded its 21-day prayer for peace this week. **Rev.** Sharpton and NANwould like to thank everyone who participated in the daily prayer for peace as war rages in the Middle East.

On his weekend broadcasts of *Politics Nation* on MSNBC, Rev. Sharpton had a representative from CAIR (the Council on American Islamic Relations), as well as Jonathan Greenblatt of ADL (the Anti-Defamation League) on to discuss the current crisis.

Both **NAN** and **Rev. Sharpton** continue to call for the protection of all civilians. On Oct. 7th they were outraged at the deaths of Israeli civilians, and today they call for a ceasefire to allow humanitarian aid to reach civilians in Gaza. Though the 21-day prayer for peace has concluded, their prayers will continue until true peace can be achieved.

On Monday, Rev. Sharpton delivered a powerful eulogy for Dexter Wade, a 37-year-old father whose death was kept secret from his family for months after he was buried in an unmarked grave. He was fatally struck by an off-duty police officer back in March, and nobody notified the family even though his mother filed a missing person's report and was actively searching for him.

"His life mattered to his mama, to his daughters," said Rev. Sharpton. "And we're going to make it matter all over this country."

Rev. Sharpton reminded everyone that justice and accountability is not yet a reality for all. Both he and Attorney Benjamin Crump have called on the Department of Justice to investigate the Jackson Police Department. Rev. Sharpton said he came to Jackson, Mississippi to give words of comfort to the grieving family, but also to make Jackson feel our discomfort around this injustice.

Bettersten Wade (Dexter's mother) spoke at the service about the months she spent desperately searching for her son, not knowing that he had been run over by an off-duty cop and buried in a penal farm. "Dexter, you made it home," she said through tears, as Wade's daughters stood next to her.

## **Health Equity Coalition**

**Rev. Sharpton** and **National Action Network** teamed up with multi-platinum recording artist **Al B. Sure!** to launch a new health equity coalition aimed at providing Medicare coverage for blood tests that could detect early signs of organ rejection in transplant recipients. **The Health Equity in Transplantation Coalition** (HETC) was announced on Tuesday, and they demand an immediate reversal of Medicare cutbacks for these vital blood tests.

"Black, Latino and underserved communities were given a lifeline with these non-invasive tests," said **Rev. Sharpton**. "That was taken away in March 2023, when a private company decided Medicare would no longer cover this life-saving measure for transplant recipients, who overwhelmingly come from these communities. It's time we reverse this decision and allow transplant recipients to have access to more and better tools – not less."

**Al B. Sure!** received a life-saving liver transplant in the summer of 2022 and is an avid spokesperson for health equity and wellness.

**HETC** is supported by a bipartisan group of transplant patients, physicians and elected officials from across the country. **Rev. Sharpton** even welcomed the support of former Republican Speaker of the House **Newt Gingrich** for the restoration of Medicare coverage. "The fact that Newt and I are in lock-step agreement – along with a broad bipartisan group of transplant patients, physicians and members of Congress – demonstrates how extremely abhorrent these attempted rollbacks are," said **Rev. On Monday, **Rev. Sharpton**, **Martin Luther King III** and **Arndrea Waters King** participated in a zoom call with Rachel and Jon Goldberg-Polin, parents of a hostage who is still held in Gaza. Their 23-year-old son Hersh was taken hostage by Hamas on October 7th, and they are desperately awaiting his release.

In the course of the conversation, **Rev. Sharpton** and the **Kings** learned that among the hostages/victims of Hamas' attack were three Africans: students Joshua Mollel and Clemence Mtenga from Tanzania, as well as an individual of South African nationality. **Rev. Sharpton** vowed to continue advocating for the release of all hostages and the protection of civilians. He has since asked to meet with the Qatari Ambassador to the UN for peace talks on getting more hostages released. This follows other measures **National Action Network** has taken, including its 21-day prayer for peace in the region.

## NY State Wealth Gap

This week, **Rev. Sharpton** and **National Action Network** called out NY State's deep racial wealth gap. A new report from the NYC Comptroller's office details how white households in New York State have a median net worth nearly *15 times* more than Black households. The median income for a white family is \$276,900, while the median income for a Black family is only \$18,870. That disparity is astounding and unacceptable.

The report's findings show that New York State has a wider racial wealth gap than in the United States as a whole. Discrepancies in wealth also persist across educational levels where white New Yorkers with only a high school degree have a net worth over three times greater than Black New Yorkers with a bachelor's degree. Generational poverty, income inequality, institutional racism and unequal access to opportunities all contribute to this tremendous gap.

As we head into an election year, **NAN** and **Rev. Sharpton** will ensure that economic equity will be a major focus, along with other pertinent issues like voting rights, police reform and more.
