OUTREACH INITIATIVES WEDU-TV OCTOBER 1, 2013 TO SEPTEMBER 21, 2014

WEDU maintains a strong internship program, offering internship opportunities to students wishing to learn about careers in public television, and television broadcasting in general. Internships are also available in non-broadcasting areas, such as accounting and special events. Students can choose from various options that best match their interests. Internships are available throughout the year.

WEDU gives tours of its facilities to schools and other organizations. During this past year at least six tours were given: two tours for Mass Communications students from the University of Tampa; one for the group "Working Women of Tampa Bay," one for Connecticut School of Broadcasting students, one for the Heritage Elementary TV crew; and one for Mount Pleasant Middle School students, all of which included the topic of television industry jobs. Two employees participated in the Great American Teach-In in November 2013 to speak to school children about careers in public broadcasting. Several staff members provided job shadowing and career exploration to six students on Disability Mentoring Day in October 2013. WEDU participated in two internship/job fairs, in October 2013 and March 2014 at which many resumes were received for internships and future job openings.
