WXKS provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Business:** Talked about new exhibits being featured in Boston in an attempt to increase tourism. The brand-new public art exhibit is called WINTERACTIVE and it's a partnership between the City of Boston and artists in Quebec, Canada. The exhibits include a girl on a swing, hovering over an alley, two massive clown heads wedged between two buildings, a unicorn in a box, and more.
- **Business / Consumer / Economy:** Talked about Meet Boston's "Dine Out Boston" event and how they've teamed up with dozens of Boston-area restaurants in hopes of boosting the economy in the area. At the event, diners found everything from sushi to tapas to a quality steak, with prix fixe options that won't break the bank.
- **Charity:** Discussing the organization's work and how they rely on community volunteers of all ages to process and donate much-needed hygiene items, clothing, outerwear, and more to thousands of children on the South Coast of Massachusetts.
- **Charity / Fundraising:** Matt Light talked about how he's currently fasting through the work of his church, his upcoming comedy show to benefit The Light Foundation, and his reaction to New England Patriot's head coach Bill Belichick leaving and what his replacement may do for the team.
- **Charity and Fundraising:** Talked about how Pawsitively 4 Pink works to ease financial burdens for low-income breast cancer patients by helping them cover some of their essential costs, how thousands of people come down with breast cancer each and every year in Massachusetts and how treatments can get very expensive, very quickly, how finances can become overwhelming, even for everyday purchases like food and housing costs, and their new statewide collaboration with Resinate to raise money for, and awareness of, breast cancer.
- **Community:** Talked about a new pop-up Winter City Sauna on Boston's City Hall Plaza in an effort to allow those in the Boston area, who might not otherwise be able to afford a nice, steamy sauna during the wet, snowy, gray, dreary New England winter, to get involved and connect with other Boston area residents.
- **Community Service:** Talked about all the ways scouting can help young women make friends, learn critical life skills, enrich their self-esteem, give back to their community, their delicious Girl Scout cookies, and what it means to be a Girl Scout. The Girl Scouts have been a fixture across America for more than 100 years, and here in Massachusetts, dozens of troops help bring girls together each and every day to make memories.
- **Consumer:** Talked about this year's Chocolate Expo and what folks can expect when they attend. The Chocolate Expo features dozens of vendors offering tastes of chocolate-laced products and special giveaways, and this year attendees had the chance to meet some Hollywood stars from the original Wonka movie.
- **Consumer / Health:** Jenna Trovato talked about how she got started with exercise and stretching for better health, her offerings in Wyndham, NH, and what types of clients she has.
- **Culture:** Talked about a Boston Youth Symphony Orchestra concert highlighting the influence of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's teachings on young people. Each year, for almost two decades, members of the Boston Youth Symphony Orchestra's Intensive

Community Program have collaborated with the Museum of African-American History to hold a special tribute to civil rights icon Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The ensemble performs spiritual and classical pieces which complement readings of some of Dr. King's powerful speeches and thoughts.

- **Culture / Community:** Discussion about offerings at Grace by Nia supper club, their special events, how they're tapped into the community, and upcoming women's events.
- **Culture / Relationships:** Dr. Sadie Allison talked about how couples should take their relationships back to the beginning to spice it up a bit and what bedroom "accessories" folks could use to spice things up in there.
- **Culture / Sports:** Discussion about how Bill Belichick may be parting ways with the New England Patriots, the poor seasons the New England Patriots have had lately, Belichick's age, and whether Belichick will retire or move on to another team.
- **Education and Community:** Talked about the work of the Bay State Model Railroad Museum, the layouts they have on display, and their efforts to connect with their community. Many model railroad lovers have setups in their basement, a bedroom, or the garage, but in Roslindale, MA, model train enthusiasts have spent decades creating a museum dedicated to the craft of creating intricate train layouts. The members of the Bay State Model Railroad Museum love to lay track, paint, build, and create, and the public can get a chance to see their work up close and personal.
- **Environment:** All activities planned for the winter months at the New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill, including an "Orchids After Dark" event. The Garden has opportunities for everyone to embrace nature all year long, no matter what the weather, on their 170+ acres of manicured grounds.
- **Environment / Climate:** Talked about the New England Forestry Foundation's work and "30 Percent Solution" to mitigate the impacts of our changing climate on the land we love. Millions of lush, healthy trees make up New England's forests, and those trees could end up being a major player in the fight against climate change. For nearly a century, the New England Forestry Foundation has made it their duty to conserve and cultivate our woodlands, and as we look ahead to an uncertain future, the Foundation is embarking on a new five-year pilot program, hoping to utilize the very trees we enjoy to help reduce our carbon emissions.
- **Environment / Weather:** Meteorologist Jeremy Reiner talked about storms that are approaching, what it means for Boston and beyond, and how to prepare for New England winter storms.
- **Family / Community:** How Big Brothers Big Sisters of Eastern Massachusetts serves the community and is in need of mentors. They talked about their mission and the benefits of volunteering for both "Bigs" and "Littles".
- **Gender / Armed Forces Service:** Talked about U.S.S. Constitution Commander Billie J. Farrell's journey through the Navy, what it's like living as a transplant in New England, the legacy she wants to leave behind to women in the service, and an upcoming award ceremony. In April, Farrell receives the "Third Lantern" award from Old North Illuminated at the "Lanterns & Luminaries" event.
- **Genealogy:** Talked about American Ancestors' 10 Million Names project and how genealogical work can be especially difficult for people directly related to some of the millions of men, women, and children who were enslaved in pre-and-post colonial America through chattel slavery. 10 Million Names is a collaborative project dedicated to recovering the names of the estimated 10 million men, women, and children of African descent who were enslaved in pre- and post-colonial America between the 1500s and 1865 and seeks to amplify the voices of people who have been telling their family stories for centuries, connect researchers and data partners with people seeking answers to family history questions, and expand access to data, resources, and information about enslaved African Americans.
- **Government:** Boston City Councilor At-Large Ruthzee Louijeune talked about her work as the first Haitian-American to serve on the council, her inauguration and path to the Council's presidency, current events, her plans to bring integrity and accountability to the Council, and what her priorities are for her term.

- **Health:** Talked about why oral health is so important and how the UMass Chan Medical School in Worcester, MA, is utilizing new grant to help restore dental health and develop more self-confidence in recovering addicts. Many people who are struggling with addiction are also dealing with a major hurdle to recovery: poor dental health that's caused by the use of substances like drugs or alcohol.
- **Health / Family / Charity:** Talked about Zebra Crossings' work and special programs that not just help boost confidence and self-love in children with chronic health conditions, but also give families some respite in a safe, understanding environment. Kids are incredibly resilient, but it can be hard to be strong all the time when you're suffering from a chronic condition like asthma, epilepsy, or heart problems. The same goes for their parents. Managing health conditions and trying to provide as "normal" a childhood as possible can take a toll on families. Zebra Crossings in Dover, NH is always around to help.
- **Mental Health:** Mel Robbins talked about how to reduce your everyday anger and how she got started in her career.
- **Race Relations:** Talked about a recent "Harm Report," a comprehensive look at how slavery and centuries of systemic racism against Black Bostonians has impacted seven key aspects of life, including housing, transportation, healthcare, and income. The report also outlined suggestions from the team at Embrace Boston on how the city can move forward in a more equitable manner and address the harms against the Black community.
- **Social Media / Podcasting:** Kim Carrigan talked about the launch of her new podcast, "Carrigan & Company," upcoming guests, and what the podcast will feature.
- **Social Media / Relationships:** Discussion about how Paul English and Rachel Cohen met on a dating app four years ago and have now launched their own dating app, Lola Dating. They talked about why they wanted to create a better app for dating, how their app is for folks who want to meet in person, how it's different, how it's unique to Boston, and how it works.
