GERMANTOWN, Md. - The military announced on Tuesday that a Germantown Marine suffered fatal wounds in an operation against ISIS over the weekend. According to the U.S. Marines, Capt. Moises Navas of Germantown and Gunnery Sgt. Diego Pongo of California were killed while assisting Iraqi forces in a mission against an ISIS stronghold on Sunday.

Both men were 34-years-old.

Navas leaves behind his wife, daughter, three sons, parents, and brother.

Navas enlisted in 2004.

His personal decorations include the Purple Heart, the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Combat Action Ribbon, two Good Conduct Medals, and the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, the Humanitarian Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and four Sea Service Deployment Ribbons.

He is survived by his daughter and parents.

Maryland Senate passes sports betting measure

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - Sports betting would be allowed at Maryland's six casinos, horse racing tracks and potentially at a Washington Redskins stadium, under a measure the Maryland Senate approved Tuesday.

The Senate voted 47-0 for the legislation, which now goes to the House. If the General Assembly approves the measure to allow wagering on professional and college sports, voters would have the final say in a November referendum.

The measure would permit sports betting at either a renovated Redskins stadium, or a new stadium built nearby. Redskins owner Dan Snyder met with Maryland lawmakers in January to discuss allowing sports betting at a new stadium.

The Redskins currently play in Landover, Maryland, in the suburbs of the nation's capital. Talks have been ongoing with Virginia, Maryland and the District of Columbia on a new stadium to replace FedEx Field when its lease expires in 2027.

Sports betting could raise about \$20 million a year for education in the state, according to state analysts. Democrats who control the legislature have been considering revenue measures to help pay for a far-reaching education proposal to improve schools that is expected to cost billions of dollars over the next decade.

In addition to the state's casinos, wagering would be allowed at horse racing tracks, including Pimlico Race Course, home to the Preakness Stakes in Baltimore, Laurel Park and the Maryland State Fair.

Bets could be placed in a sports-wagering lounge, on a self-service kiosk or machine in a facility with a license or through online sports wagering by someone physically located in the state.

The U.S. Supreme Court in 2018 struck down a 1992 federal law prohibiting sports betting in most states. Since the law's repeal, it's been up to individual states to decide their own sports-gambling course and 14 have now legalized it, including several states neighboring Maryland. Six other states are expected to launch sports betting operations this year.

Biden, on video, lashes out at Detroit worker in profanity-laced gun dispute

Former Vice President **Joe Biden** got into a heated and profanity-laced argument with a worker at a Fiat-Crysler auto plant Tuesday while touring a factory in **Detroit**, after the individual accused the Democratic presidential candidate of trying to take away his Second Amendment rights.

"You're full of sh-- ... I support the Second Amendment," Biden shot back, stressing he's not going to take guns away.

The worker then told Biden, "You're working for me, man," and told Biden that he saw an online video supporting his claim that Biden is hostile to the Second Amendment.

Biden, pointing at the individual as they were mere inches apart in the middle of a crowd, said he's not working for him and told him not to be "such a horse's a--."

Biden, at one point mistakenly referring to "AR-14's," went on to press the individual to acknowledge that machine guns are illegal. Biden appeared to then misspeak in saying AR-15's are illegal, before questioning why anyone needs "100 rounds."

The dispute, caught on camera, happened at the Fiat-Chrysler plant as Biden stumped for votes in Michigan, the biggest prize among the states voting Tuesday with 125 delegates at stake.

Biden earlier told the workers, "You made me a hero when I was getting a lot of heat for the bailout, the rescue ... You guys saved management. Management didn't save you." He also called the workers, "The best damn workers in the world."

Sanders campaign manager Faiz Shakir quote tweeted a video of the interaction from a CBS reporter Tuesday that was shared by GOP Rapid Response Director Steve Guest simply saying, "Oh no."

That prompted a response from Symone D. Sanders, a senior advisor to the Biden campaign. She said, "This was predictable."

Biden was previously criticized for apparently offering former presidential contender Beto O'Rourke a gun control role in his administration in a pre-Super Tuesday rally. O'Rourke said last year on the campaign trail, "Hell, yes, we're going to take your AR-15, your AK-47."

"I want to make something clear – I'm gonna guarantee you, this is not the last you're seeing of this guy – you're gonna take care of the gun problem with me, you're gonna be the one who leads this effort," Biden said of O'Rourke. "I'm counting on you, I'm counting on you, we need you badly."

Priest tests positive for coronavirus

D.C. Mayor Bowser recommends a two-week self-quarantine for anyone who visited Christ Church Georgetown during a six-day period after the rector tested positive for the first confirmed case of coronavirus in D.C.

WASHINGTON (FOX 5 DC) - D.C. Mayor Bowser recommends a two-week self-quarantine for anyone who visited [Christ Church](#) Georgetown during a six-day period after the rector tested positive for the first confirmed case of coronavirus in D.C.

On Monday night, D.C. officials and a spokesperson says a 39-year-old man who is an organist at the church also tested positive for the virus.

The church says approximately 550 parishioners are in self-quarantine through March 9. Church officials say a large number of parishioners have been contacted and they "have not heard of a single instance where a parishioner is not following this guidance."

Bowser made the recommendation at a press conference on Monday. "Early Sunday morning, based on information gathered by D.C. Health, D.C. Health recommended temporarily pausing services at Christ Church Georgetown and the church further suspended all services and meetings until further notice."

"D.C. Health has been reaching out to known contacts to begin the process of self-quarantine," Bowser said. "As of late, last night, D.C. Health is recommending that anyone who visited Christ Church Georgetown either on February 24th, or between February 28th and March 3rd, self-quarantine themselves at home for 14 days since the last time they visited the church."

"D.C. Health has been in communication with the church and has been reaching out to congregants with this information and guidance," Bowser said. "Any person who visited the church on those dates should call D.C. Health or their health care providers if they develop symptoms -- or if they have experienced symptoms of COVID 19 in the 14 days since they visited the church."

Rev. Tim Cole, the rector of the historic Episcopal church, remains hospitalized.

Christ Church Georgetown spokesman Rob Volmer and his family are among the members currently in self-quarantine. He told FOX 5's Evan Lambert what it's been like so far on Monday evening.

"It means working from home, it means school from home. It means that we've reached out to all of our primary health care providers and let them know the

situation. We're taking our temperature twice a day," said Volmer. "We're doing a lot of cleaning so far. Looking at the projects. Making sure I have the equipment to do the different projects, dusting out the old board games. And looking at this, yes we're quarantined but you gotta make the most of it."

One parishioner, Jim Cannon of Silver Spring, told the Washington Post he's not planning to quarantine and spent Monday playing golf in Reston, Virginia, albeit at a distance from his friends.

Of this information, Volmer told FOX 5: "I think they're putting other people at risk. I don't. Trying to prove a point. What point? That the mayor's wrong and your doctor's right? I just don't think it's worth the risk. It's two weeks out of your life. Let's put our community before our own needs at this point in time."

Georgetown Day School will be closed Tuesday for a deep-cleaning. A statement on the [school's website](#) says community members closely-affiliated with Christ Church attend the school. School officials say they do not expect the school to be closed on a long-term basis.

The number of confirmed cases in the District is now five.

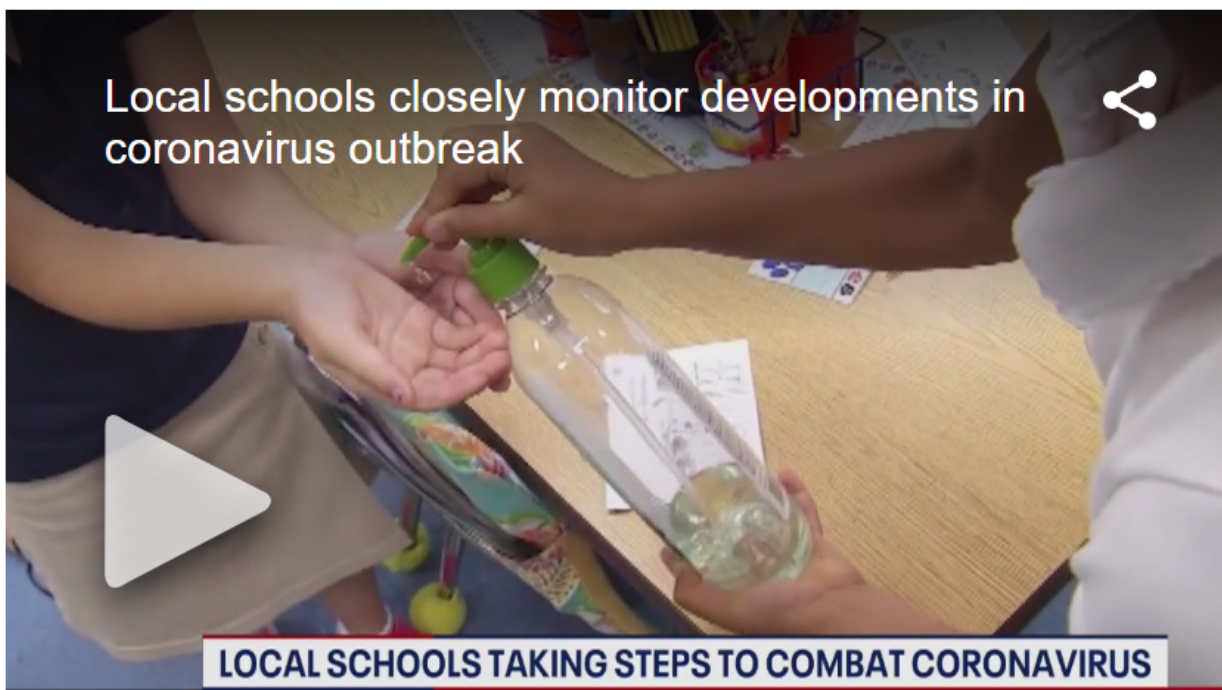

WASHINGTON - Amtrak is canceling nonstop Acela service between D.C. and New York through Memorial Day because of "reduced demand" caused by the coronavirus outbreak.

The suspension will start Tuesday, the company says. It will affect Amtrak's 2401, 2402, 2403 Acela Express trains, or three trips a day.

The change in service comes as New York officials battle the [outbreak, which has infected at least 76 people in New York state.](#)

Two New Yorkers have since tested positive for the disease after attending [AIPAC's global conference in downtown Washington](#). The outbreak is also [clustered in Montgomery County](#).

Amtrak also says it will waive change fees for any rides booked by April 30 because of the outbreak. The company says it is stepping up its cleaning protocol on trains.

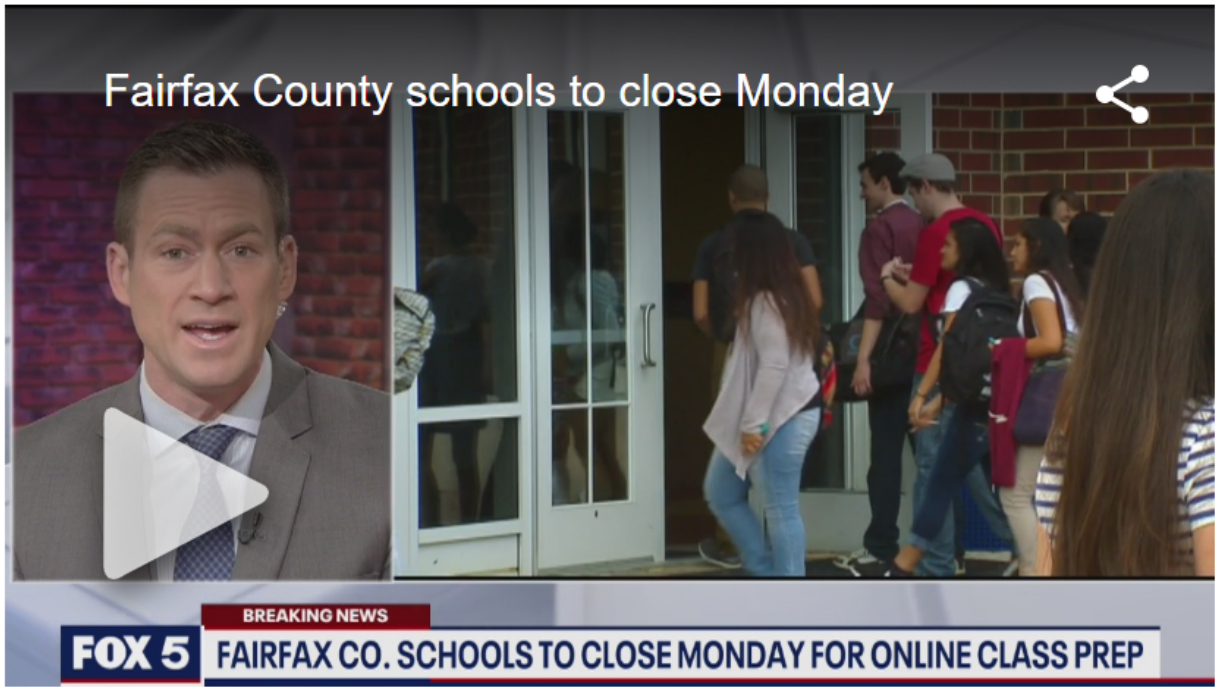

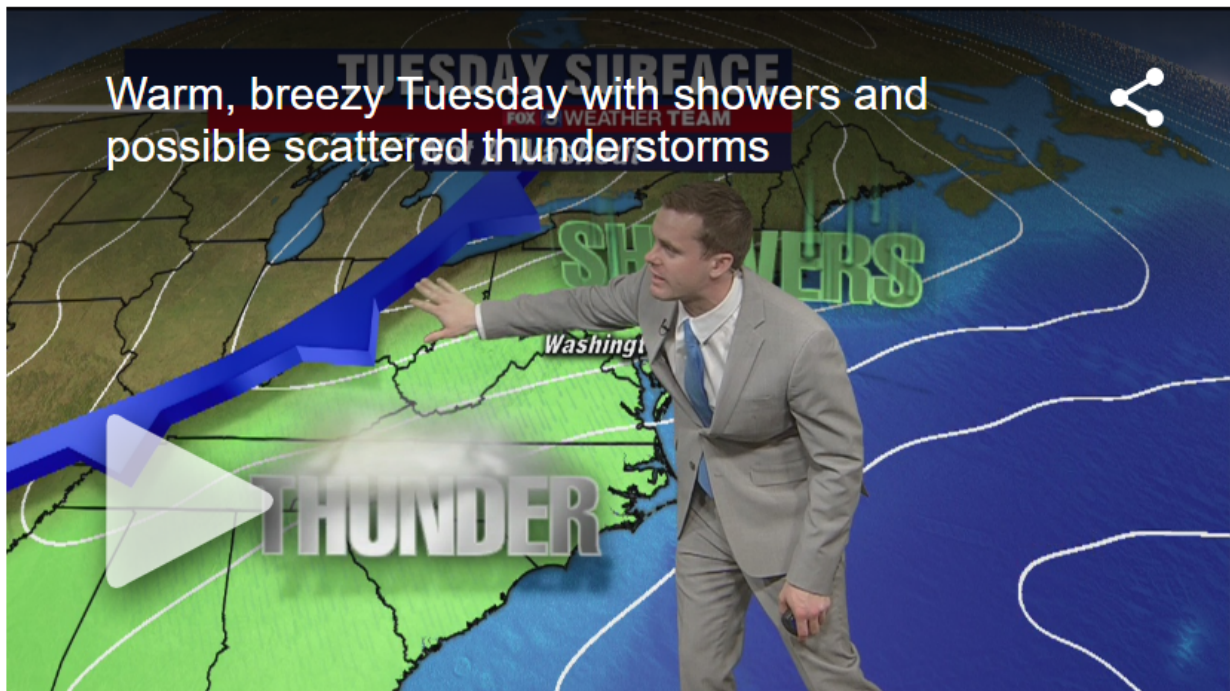

An investigator revealed new details about the discovery of a child's body on property belonging to relatives of a Tennessee woman whose daughter was reported missing last month.

At a quickly-arranged court hearing Monday, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation Special Agent Brian Fraley said the body found in Blountville had the "exact clothing" that Megan Boswell said her daughter, 15-month-old [Evelyn Mae Boswell](#), was wearing when she went missing, WJHL-TV reported.

Other clothing, diapers and toys that would have belonged to the child were also found on the property, Fraley said. Results of an autopsy were still pending.

Megan Boswell, 18, was charged with filing a false report in her daughter's disappearance and has been held in the Sullivan County jail. Judge James Goodwin increased Boswell's bond Monday to \$150,000, according to news outlets.

Fraley also testified that Boswell has made "inculpatory statements" during interviews with investigators since her daughter went missing, WJHL-TV reported. Inculpatory statements are legally described as implying or placing guilt.

Boswell's attorney Brad Sproles declined an interview with the television station, which was the only TV station in the courtroom Monday.
